What is Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting is affirmative and fun-focused and is designed to engage the whole family in great activities. Parents and Siblings are welcomed and encouraged to participate. There are currently 1.3 million Cub Scouts and 400,000 adult volunteers in the U.S.

Who Can Join? When?

Pack 544 is open to *all* children in Grades K-5. Children may join *any* time of year. Church membership is not required.

The Pack Organization

Cub Scout Packs are made up of Dens and are led by one or more Den Leaders (parent volunteers). Dens typically meet twice-a-month and the entire Pack meets monthly. Dens are organized as follows:

- Kindergarten (or age 6): Lions
- 1st Grade (or age 7): Tigers
- 2nd Grade (or age 8): Wolves
- 3rd Grade (or age 9): Bears
- 4th Grade (or age 10): Webelos
- 5th Grade (or age 11): Arrow of Light

Regular Den and Pack meetings are held during the school year; when we normally work on projects and activities. There are a few Pack activities over the summer as well.

Packs also participate in larger District & Council activities, like Pinewood Derby and several activities at Cub Adventure Camp.

How Much Does It Cost?

It costs nothing to come and check it out!

Annual dues are set by the Pack, and collected in the fall. This includes annual membership in the **Scouts BSA** and Cub Scout Pack 544, all awards and recognition, *Boys' Life* magazine subscription and a Pinewood Derby® car kit. There are some additional costs for other items which we will be glad to go over with you. **There are plenty of fundraising opportunities to help with the costs.**

Activities and Camping

Pack 544 usually has several outings and opportunities throughout the scout year.

In addition to Council-sponsored camping opportunities at Cub Adventure Camp (Maidens, VA), we schedule other overnight family camping trips each year.

As the old saying goes, "*you get out of it what you put into it.*" All Pack parents and guardians are encouraged to participate; to ensure a great Scouting experience for all.

*Adult partners of Lion and Tiger Cub Scouts **must** participate in all activities.*

Advancement

As boys complete requirements, perform service projects, and participate in activities they earn belt loops, pins and rank badges. They also earn other awards (patches) for special activities and events. Some requirements are completed in Den or Pack Meetings and others at home.

The highest award in Cub Scouts is the **Arrow of Light**. This award prepares the Scout for the transition to **Boy Scouts**.
