PLDT Inc. has ended negotiations with CVC Capital Partners for a minority stake in its data center business, as the telco giant shifts focus to a new potential investor,

The move marks the second time PLDT has pulled out of a sale process for its data center arm. In August, the company scrapped talks with Japan's Nippon Telegraph and Telephone Corp. after the latter sought a 51% stake—
