DATA CENTERS KEY TO PHILIPPINES' DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION—BOI

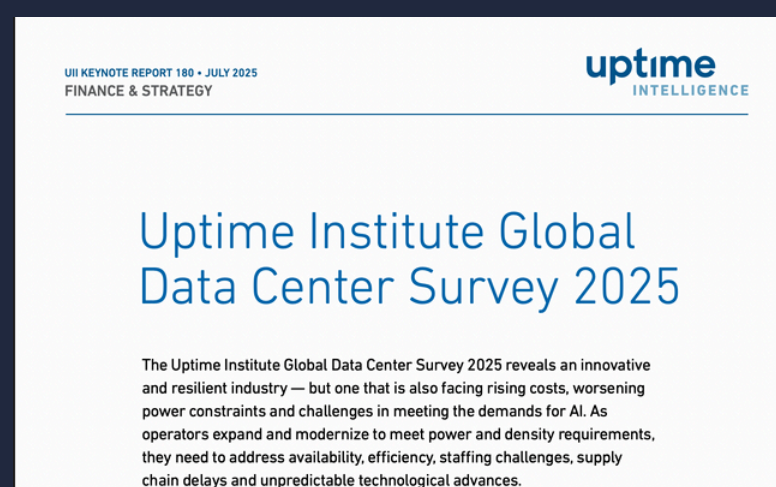

META TO SPEND HUNDREDS OF BILLIONS TO BUILD AI DATA CENTRES



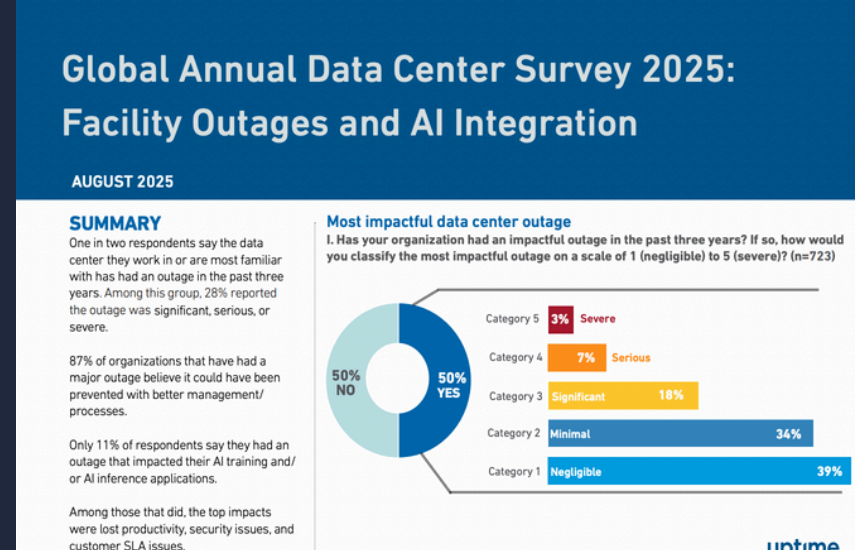
Meta's founder Mark Zuckerberg has said the social media giant will spend hundreds of billions of dollars on building huge AI data centres in the US.

The first multi-gigawatt data centre, called Prometheus, is expected to come online in 2026, Zuckerberg said.

He said one of the sites would cover an area nearly the size of Manhattan (59.1 sq km/22.8 sq miles). Meta has invested heavily in efforts to develop what it called "superintelligence" - technology that it said could out-think the smartest humans. The company, which has made most of its money from online advertising, generated more than \$160bn in revenue in 2024.

UPTIME INSTITUTE RELEASES GLOBAL ANNUAL DATA CENTER SURVEY 2025 ON FACILITY OUTAGES AND AI INTEGRATION



Half of data center professionals report experiencing an outage in the past three years, with 28% rating it as significant, serious, or severe. Most organizations (87%) believe such outages could have been prevented with improved management and processes. While AI workloads are less frequently affected, only 11% reported outages impacting AI training or inference, with key consequences including lost productivity, security risks, and customer SLA disruptions.

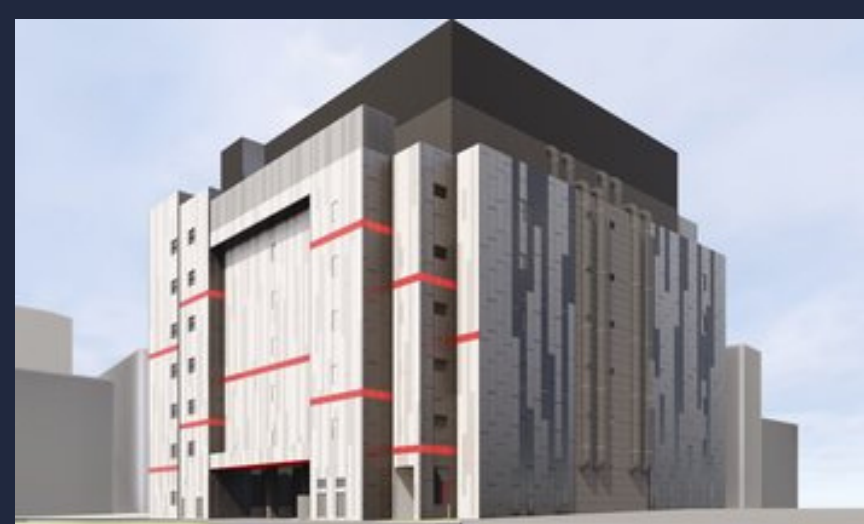

KONEKTADONG PINOY BILL LAPSES INTO LAW

The bill aims to expand internet access, streamline the licensing process for internet service providers and encourage new and smaller companies to enter the market.

Data center firm Equinix has secured new sustainable financing to fuel green projects in Singapore. The colo firm this week announced the issuance of \$650 million (US\$505.3m) in green bonds in Singapore.

Equinix said it would use the proceeds to "further advance the company's longstanding commitment to sustainability leadership and reducing its environmental impact globally."
