Maybe you follow another tradition of waiting until Christmas Eve night to decorate the tree. Have you already started listening to Christmas music? The most celebrated season for secular and Christians of all ilk is upon us. Are you ready? Or not?

When we find ourselves passionate about an idea, a cause, or even the simple habit of Christmas traditions, we are tempted to look at anyone who does not share the same enthusiasm as somehow missing out or, even worse, wrong about their choices. We think everyone should share the same joy and excitement about "It's a Wonderful Life," Charles Dickens's tale, Christmas cards, outside lights, or midnight service. You can extend this scenario to numerous ones involving real-life issues of personal choice. How do you feel about our educational system - the practices of private or public schools? Jessica may have looked familiar to some of you, as she made a virtual appearance during Advent 2020, performing Jason Robert Brown's, "Christmas Lullaby." Bryce Kessler, a frequent guest musician at First UCC, returned (virtually) a few times with his cello. He contributed to my arrangement of "This Is Me," which featured my husband, Gary, as the soloist. Bryce most recently appeared in our Thanksgiving service, playing for the choir's performance of "For Everyone Born" - a piece he introduced to me years ago. I've been fortunate to become good friends with Ursuline Academy's new Director of Performing Arts (my previous job), Michael Sawzin, who is a classically-trained saxophonist. Michael helped me record a quartet arrangement of "What a Wonderful World," which featured digital artwork by our own Mason B.!

I can't begin express how thankful I am to the groups and everyone mentioned above - for their time, talents, commitment, and friendship. I always look forward to the choir's next song, the handbell's perfect run-through, or planning a Sunday with a good friend or the youth. I look forward to work every day, whether I drive into church or just walk over to my computer at home.
