Recently I pulled out my Army dress greens and reminisced about my two summers as an Army chaplain. My youthfulness served me well as I ministered to men and women who were away from home for the first time in many cases. Most of us were still in our 20s. Hand-written letters were usually the only option of communication (still a little before cell phones and internet service – Yes, I am that old). The reception of a letter made a service person's week or even month. There were deep connections and heartfelt expressions of longing and hope. Most could not wait to get back home.

I learned from service personnel that December is the saddest time of year for many of them. The pain of separation for the holidays is acute. They miss their partner or parents. They miss Sis' or their Brother. Most especially, even the family pooch. In some cases, they fear they might not live to see another holiday with the family. They know they are missing out on family moments. For many of us, I have no doubt December will always carry a strong dose of melancholy and heartache. We feel alone. The holidays are not the same. Grief and loss punch us in the gut. The holidays may never have been good to us nor does the prospect of a Merry Christmas ever seem possible.

Into this world of contradictions comes Christ. Yes, that is the power of the Good News. Christ indeed brings the hope we long to hear and to feel. A hope rooted in the best that this life offers and beyond. Christ brings the love that springs to life our deepest need to be seen. Christ is the real presence of the stranger who extends a heartfelt act of generosity. Christ is the active witness of truth and justice in a world that tramples the poor and forgotten. The choir and handbell choir are slated to play two pieces each at the 11:00 p.m. service. The chancel choir will sing two calming anthems, "Bring Us Hope" and "Still." Of course, the night will also be filled with congregational singing of our favorite carols and end with a candlelit rendition of "Silent Night," led by the handbells. If you cannot make these services in person, both Christmas Eve gatherings will be livestreamed via Facebook Live. The choir closes out the month by singing "Hurry, Shepherds, Run!" on December 28^{th} .



Other dates to note this month include the big church photo taking place after worship on December 7, the housing of Found House IHN families beginning on the 7th, and the church Christmas party on the 21st.
