

I always enjoy the weekly laughter that takes place during choir, handbell choir, the youth bible study, and staff conversations in the office with Dan and Kim. I am grateful for the many church connections that have helped me (and will continue to help me) laugh and move forward this Lenten season and beyond.

We had great conversations with fellow faith formation leaders in our state, and these chats energized me to continue thinking outside of the box, especially how we as a church can be the church by being more involved in the community. Currently, our youth continues to read and discuss Brianna Wiest's "The Mountain is You." I am looking at another book to follow up this one, though I see us getting out and about the community more this spring and summer. I am in conversation with the music director at Lakeview UCC in Maineville (whose daughter takes part in *come una*) about taking First UCC's youth to one of their Sunday services; we would combine with their adult choir to perform a piece or two. This would be a wonderful opportunity to highlight the youth in their church as I did in our sanctuary in January. I will have more information in the coming weeks.

- Call to Order -- June called the meeting to order.
- II. Devotion -- Pastor Dan
- III. Treasurer's Report (Christy): The December reports were accepted, and approval was given to pay December and some water related expenses. It was suggested that we provide Christy with an address list of all Mission Partners. We also differentiated for her the Youth Fund versus Youth General Fund. We then instructed her to pay the plumber for the work due to water damage done. VIII. MISSIONS TEAM

MARCC – ZOOM meeting this Wednesday at Noon to discuss the housing Health Ministries – TeriLynn and Kathie S. worked after church Sunday to start to go through things from the office.

IX. MUSIC TEAM – lots of things happening with the choir and bell choir and special guests. Great change for New Year's Day service. Special Music coming the rest of the month.

X. Facilities Committee (Ed)

Mitigation – report from All Brothers has yet to be received. They told Ed it would be here this week.

Insurance Investigator's Report – Notes were written up from the meeting and sent to members of the Board. We then suggested that we ask if the "carpet" can be separate from the "General Contractor's" work.

Questions were asked about policy and are we up to date code wise. Fans were used to help out and will be returned to IHN area.

Insurance will coach us on how to make sure we report all things that happened and all repairs. We need to get the volunteers (list from 12/24) to give us how many hours they worked helping clean up. We are to list work done, pictures of damaged goods for F&L. Document all things related, tools that were damaged in rooms, trophies, financial records need to be gone through and other church memorabilia.

We need all bills submitted for things done. We also talked about submitting the increased water bill since we were instructed to turn the faucets on and the main valve was not totally turned off.

IX. Old Business -

Pastor Dan brought up that the MOVIE should be sending us a check in the next week for use of our facility during the filming here in College Hill.

Bruce asked the Church Board about when we might send out a Stewardship Letter which encourages the members and friends to Cultivate Generous

Congregations. It was decided to send it out in February after we know more about our financial needs for the renovation after the Christmas Eve Flooding.

The Church Board decided we need a separate committee for the RESTORATION. Several names were suggested with specific skills. Moved – Christine Second – Darrell Approved – All in Favor

XI. New Business -

Sink Hole – Ed reported he had consulted with the plumber, who said the hole is not expanding and could wait till the spring for more feedback. No report has been received yet from the City, Water Works or Sewer District. Darrell reported that Geiler Plumbing is checking on the problem.

Ed also reported that Bill Spatz had noticed the vent in the Kitchen wall was in need of repair / replacement and this was done for a cost of \$75.00. The bill is to be submitted.

Water by Grease Trap in Laundry Room – A.K. Bulter reported that the grease trap needs to be replaced as the welds are leaking and causing the problem. They have a company which they use for these, Robert Jones, who will make a new one for a cost of \$1,965.00. Moved: Darrell Second: Christine Approved: All approved

It was also suggested that before the new grease trap be installed that the floor around that area be cleaned up. A couple of names were suggested to help with this job. Pastor Dan will follow up.
