Yes, we can use humor to deny the pain of life, but I have found in most cases this is not true here. Updates on Music, Media, and Faith Formation at First UCC

I'm sitting down to write this article just days before the start of Holy Week. With exciting handbell and choir performances, special musical guests Becky Andres and Bryce Kessler, axe throwing, an egg hunt, and so much more taking place throughout the week, I know it will be a wonderful celebration. So, what awaits us in the month of April?

Six years ago on April 1, First UCC became an Open and Affirming congregation. This momentous occasion speaks volumes to me as a member of the LGBTQIA+ community. Born and raised in the Catholic church, I struggled to feel welcomed by the church throughout my teen and young adult years. Truth be told, I drifted away from religion because of it. By being an ONA church, First UCC not only welcomes but embraces those in the LGBTQIA+ community and shows them that we are all beloved

The handbell choir returns on April 14 with a reflective arrangement of "Fount of Every Blessing."

Dan and I are working on finalizing housing for the youth mission trip to Cleveland this summer. Exact dates are July 8-11 and once housing is in place, I will announce a cost. Like our trip to D.C. two summers ago, we plan on traveling in large vans, departing Monday morning from church and arriving back late on Thursday. We will work with local churches on rehabbing old parking lots into beautiful gardens and learn more about the United Church of Christ in the town where its national ministries are based. Two major website updates took place last month. I have finally published a page on the church's history, with pictures of the churches on Apple and Hoffner Streets, as well as brief summaries of the life and happenings while the congregation gathered there. #### **Holy Humor Sunday on April 7**

Pastor Dan usually doesn't need a reason to add some humor to illustrate a story or lesson, but he definitely has reason to mix in some jokes on April 7. Read on: Courtesy of Christine Longhurst's blog and Immanuel UCC's administrative assistant comes this:

Laughter Sunday (also known as Holy Humour Sunday, Hilarity Sunday, God's Laughter Sunday, Bright Sunday or Holy Fools Sunday) has its roots in a number of different Christian traditions.

Churches in 15th century Bavaria used to celebrate the Sunday after Easter as Risus Paschalis ('God's Joke,' or 'the Easter laugh'). Priests would deliberately include amusing stories and jokes in their sermons in an attempt to make the faithful laugh. After the service, people would gather together to play practical jokes on one another and tell funny stories. It was their way of celebrating the resurrection of Christ – the supreme joke God played by raising Jesus from the dead.

The observance of Risus Paschalis was officially outlawed by Pope Clement X in the 17th century. Perhaps people were having too much fun.
