With the war atrocities in Ukraine, the shootings in a Buffalo grocery store, also in a California church, and horrifically at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, it is expected that many of us want to pull the bed covers over our heads and remain there. The sad and hopeless feelings are profound even if we don't know any of the victims or if we are even remotely tied to the situation. There is a heaviness to life that all are feeling these days.

"Ok, Time to Get out of bed"

On Memorial Day, thousands got out of bed and meandered downtown to make a difference. The annual Hunger Walk took place with a great turnout from First UCC (30+). People rallied around a common cause to serve the community and address hunger. It was a festive event where old and new friends alike hung out together and cheered everyone on; hoofed it over the Clay Wade Bailey Bridge and strolled back to the Banks; or they sprinted their way through the streets of Covington and back past Paul Brown Stadium like our own Jimmy W did in an impressive time of under 25 minutes — he finished in the top 25 of the men!! Ander and Nate WG were the fastest fruit and egg in the race!! (see photos if you don't know what that means). With the events of the Spring throughout the world, the Hunger Walk was a bit cathartic for all who participated. Once we got out of bed, we felt like we were doing something positive for the community and for our spirit.






What's the Buzz?

Written by bell hooks, <u>All About Love</u> offers radical new ways to think about love by showing its interconnectedness in our private and public lives. The author explains how our everyday notions of what it means to give and receive love often fail us, and how these ideals are established in early childhood. She offers a rethinking of self-love (without narcissism) that will bring peace and compassion to our personal and professional lives, and asserts the place of love to end struggles between individuals, in communities, and among societies.

IV. Pastor's Report (Pastor Dan): Pastor Dan shared the following updates:

- A. Services Pastor Dan shared times for Easter week services and events, and requested help from Church Board members to serve as greeters, readers, and Easter-egg hiders. Dan noted that there are extra funds in the budget for special music at Easter and Christmas. Kathie and Bill will coordinate check-writing between the Memorial Fund and the General Fund.
- B. Educational gatherings After-church gatherings for youth and adults will begin in mid-May, with Pastor Dan leading sessions for adults and Jimmy and other volunteers with youth. Jimmy will provide more details at the Congregational Meeting. Donut sponsors are needed for these events. A sign-up sheet will be created.
- C. Mission CAIN's ribbon cutting for Annette's Place (named for Annette Liebing) and their pantry re-opening was held April 11, with Ollie Helm

recognized for her volunteer efforts. Christ's Community is becoming involved with housing and foster care, in addition to their pantry. IHN will continue housing families experiencing homelessness in motels through the summer. First Church's drive for the neighborhood family affected by fire raised more than \$2,000 in cash and gift cards. Many thanks to those who donated.

- D. Congregational Meeting The meeting will be held Sunday, April 24 following church service. The Youth will prepare a breakfast fundraiser for their summer trip to D.C. Committee heads are asked to submit a 1-page report to share at the meeting.
- E. Sauerkraut Dinner Pastor Dan and Amy are interested in holding an outdoor Sauerkraut Dinner, along with beer/wine tent, in September 2022. The Church Board was in support. The idea will be presented at the Congregational Meeting.
- F. May 1 Pastor Dan shared that he will be away for a retreat on Sunday, May 1. Rev. Karen Geiger-Behm will preach.

III. Committee Reports

A. Facilities (Darrell) – Another company will be coming out to look at and offer recommendations and an estimate to deal with the building's foundation issues. An issue was reported about fill dirt being used under the topsoil in the new Green Space, which will be addressed when Rack returns this spring to work on the planned walkways and reseeding.

B. **Meditation Garden** (Pastor Dan for Amy) – The garden crew was able to hold a few Saturday work days, but several were cancelled due to rain and cold. The pond still needs to be drained.
