If we want to stay healthy, it is important for us to get our steps in. We hear this daily. We check our fit-bits and iPhone religiously. We pay attention even if we don't have any devices to remind us of the number of steps we have made.

As your Spiritual Fitness coach, I tell you now is the time for the Church to "STEP UP." We have added a part to our Sunday services in which an individual and/or group remind us during the announcements that we have opportunities to be Christian in our response to needs within and beyond the Church. In past years this has been called our "Mission Moment." I find myself eagerly awaiting each week to hear how Church folks share their excitement about ways others can serve within the church community. One week it is a challenge to fill our CAIN buckets with cleaning supplies and hygiene items; the next week it is our Music team tapping the stand and calling for more choir and handbell participants. Soon it will be our Sauerkraut and Rummage Sale teams inviting volunteers to have fun and be in fellowship at these events. Let Jimmy or me know what and how you want to "STEP UP" and you are invited to share.

As with our literal exercise steps and activity, one must be ready for the challenge. That's where the spiritual renewal and life of the church equip us for ministry and service. Our prayer life, study, worship, music, and fellowship inspire us to want to step up and serve. It's really a chicken-and-egg proposition. 


## What's the Buzz?

Written by Bell Hooks, *All About Love* offers radical new ways to think about love by showing its interconnectedness in our private and public lives. The author explains how our everyday notions of what it means to give and receive love often fail us, and how these ideals are established in early childhood. She offers a rethinking of self-love (without narcissism) that will bring peace and compassion to our personal and professional lives, and asserts the place of love to end struggles between individuals, in communities, and among societies.

First UCC members and friends will gather after our morning worship service twice a month to share insights as we read our way through the many facets of Love and consider ways to put these ideas into action.

### **Board Meeting Minutes**

#### MINUTES OF THE CHURCH BOARD MEETING OF JUNE 13, 2022

**PRESENT**: Pastor Dan, Milt Hauck, Bill Henrich, Darrell Copenhaver, June Bronnert, Ruth Beck, Kathy Steinhard (?) and perhaps others.

Lacking a quorum, any decisions made at this meeting will need to be ratified at our next Church Board meeting.

Darrell reported on Corpus Com. – Fishes and Loaves. He noted that the Church Board contributed over \$1,000 to the Hunger Walk. The Music Fund received over \$800. Youth Fund is doing well. CAIN will be doing much better with the funds raised by First UCC.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Dan noted that attendance at worship has been stable. He noted that Jeanne Phillips will be subbing for Jimmy during the next few weeks.

The Youth Trip is a go. American University will be housing our students and youth leaders. No additional insurance is needed for the trip as long as parent have signed the liability forms for their kids.

Dan noted that the Sauerkraut Dinner is scheduled for Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> and will be an outdoor event. No additional funds are needed for serving beer as long as the beer is served by a designated bartender from a designated brew house or bar.

Pastor Dan noted that adult education is taking place in the church parlor following worship several Sundays a month.

**BUILDING AND GROUNDS COM.** (it's a dirty business ha-ha)

Darrell reported that the gutters are clogged and will need attention soon. Pastor Dan noted that he knows someone who might be interested in the task. Darrell also noted that the church property was hit with some

vandalism. Spray painting was found on several locations including the Boy Scouts' trailer. He and Ed Bosse cleaned up the paint.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Bill, Christine, and Pastor Dan need to meet regarding an update to the Constitution of the church.

Kathy Steinhard and Christy Meyer are looking at proposing a procedure for getting and paying bills. June will check with Kathy to clarify the procedure. Darrell has indicated he is willing to be a conduit for getting the bills to Christy.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Rev. Derek Terry who has been one of our guest preachers, was designated leadership of the Open and Affirming Coalition of the UCC.

Another issue discussed was how to take care of expenses which lay persons might incur while working on a project. Darrell noted that his work on the Buildings and Grounds Com. Gives him a maximum of \$600.00 that he is authorized to spend without further Board involvement. Should a project require more than that, he will need to seek Board approval. Perhaps this is a model for how to cover expenses incurred by laypersons on behalf of the church.

There being no further business, we adjourned at about \*8:15 p.m. Irrevently submitted by Ruth Beck in the absence of Christine.
