The pipes at church burst on Christmas Eve. What a blessing!! Yes, what a blessing that we had not closed church earlier when most others had cancelled their services. Our church would have been empty for possibly three days, and there might not have been a metaphorical Christmas birth let alone Easter resurrection from that damage. Fortunately, Sue and Christina Bilz had arrived early for the Christmas Eve service and came upon the flood. Two by two others entered the First UCC ark and began to bail out the water and begin the journey back to a dry facility. The Narthex, parish nurse office, and the downstairs boiler room were the areas mainly affected. I've always considered myself a "Glass Half-Full kind of person." This Christmas, my glass and our church's glass runneth over. We are blessed and fortunate.

Beyond the limited damage, our collective cup runneth over for many reasons. The spirit of the Advent season was beautiful. From the church gatherings of the Senior Social and the Guild to our Sunday Christmas luncheon there was a joyful camaraderie and love. The Senior group gathered only days following the death of one of their main contributors, Linda Blatt. The Guild laughed and made merrily even as members have challenges in their lives. And the Church paused and celebrated together on December 18th with the rush of the season upon all. First Church served hundreds this season at our shared ministries of CAIN and Christ's Community in addition to the beloved souls within our walls. Even the manger scene figures made it to dry land before the water did any damage to them. These are snapshots of the holiness of the season. I trust you have your own reasons to see the seasonal glass as half full.

Both Jimmy and my phones and social media accounts were blowing up when news got out about the water leak. The community responded with support, prayers, towels and buckets. The collective efforts were symbolic of making room at the inn for the Christ child to be born.

- I. Call to Order -- June called the meeting to order.
- II. Devotion -- Pastor Dan
- III. Election of Officers –

President – June was nominated by Christine, seconded by Milt Vice President – Christine was nominated by Ruth, seconded by June Recording Secretary – Bruce was nominated by Milt (after some kind words from Pastor Dan), seconded by Bill

Financial Secretary - Darrell was nominated by Bill, seconded by Bruce

IV. Recording Secretary's Report (Bruce) – The October report was accepted with one correction.

V. Financial Secretaries Report – there was one correction to the report after verifying with Ed and Bill. The amount of the transfer from the Endowment Fund was \$17,160.00.

- VI. Margie and Ruth voiced they were having problems hearing all the discussion. All members agreed to speak up and Pastor Dan moved the tablet toward the speaker during the rest of the meeting. Margie also said Bill S. wants to know about the Scout Trailer and the sink hole.
- VII. Treasurer's Report Christy's report was copied for all present to discuss. We were concerned regarding the format of her pages. Milt commented that a statement of revenue and expenses is what he wants to see, other than that there is too much information. Attachment #1 is the regular report, Attachment #2 had question regarding it and that we might use it for future use. The October reports were accepted, and approval was given to pay November expenses.

- VIII. Music Fund Bill reported that the fund was instituted in 1955 as a separate fund. Up to this point, it has had occasional use until the last 5 or so years. It is being used more by Jimmy than previously used. Therefore, with the permission of Virginia Krebs and himself, he closed the account at Northside Bank and deposited the money into the music part of the general fund for distribution by the Treasurer. The balance of the account and the transfer was \$1,751.69. The receipt was given to Darrell.
- **IX. Pastor's Report** Pastor Dan submitted his report to the Church Board, which included the following updates and reflections:

Health Ministry proposal from Teri Lynn Stackhouse. She will be invited to the December meeting to discuss her proposal with the board.

- Phil's Place Pastor Dan is coordinating greeting guests and distributing
 meals at CAIN on Monday afternoons. He welcomes volunteers to help with
 this ministry. First Church continues to provide meals on the fifth Monday of
 the month, and as needed. Dan thanked Lynn and Paul Kluesener and Susie
 Cairns for their leadership with meal preparation.
- IHN Hosting Our first hosting since the pandemic will be the week of November 27, coordinated by Linda Krebs and Pastor Dan. We will host four weeks in 2023.
- Book Study & Pulpit to the Pew Series Pastor Dan reported that these Sunday activities take place on alternating Sundays, offering an opportunity for deeper reflection on texts and spiritual conversation. All are welcome to join.
- Friends and New Members December 11th will be the date for this and a recommitment from a member.
- **Baptisms/Confirmations/Weddings/Funerals** Pastor Dan reports he was very busy with all these things during the past month.
- November 20th Pastor Dan gone and Teri Lynn Stackhouse will be the supply minister.

Bruce asked about the Ceremony of the Rose, which usually happens in November. Pastor Dan said it had just been forgotten and after some discussion it was decided to have it in the Spring of next year.

- SONKA Meeting Bruce reported on the recent SONKA meeting done via ZOOM and proposed plan to move from Association Minister to Regional Elders who would be over a group of churches and the ministers serving them.
- Christmas Pageant Pastor Dan reported that Jean Krebs is interested in putting on an intergenerational pageant for the church and is working on getting it together.
- Facilities Managers Darrell reported that the water lines were blown out
 and leaks discovers and the grease trap was cleaned out. The sink hole
 problem will be worked on. The Scout trailer is sinking into the group and
