But we needed something else. Time was running out. It was three hours before my time to be at CAIN. Just pizza for dinner wouldn't do it. Then, out of the blue, a UCC church member calls saying she had "Goodie Bags" to drop off to use however I wanted to use them. The bags contained more than enough healthy snacks and fun items for 50 families. The perfect amount. Thank you, CAIN, for hosting these weekly meals; Thank you, UCC, for being a part of ministry beyond our walls; Thank you, Holy Spirit, for always arriving at the right time!

Our fall schedules are full. School days and events pack the weeks. Summer vacations are forgotten as the workload just piles up like the leaves. Metaphorically and literally, we can feel dumped on by life. Yet, this month of November is the time we set aside to say two words that we can forget to say – Thank You. When each of you goes to prayer or sits in the pews on a Sunday, listens to music, or maybe just takes a stroll along your street, there is no doubt in my mind that you discover the blessing of the Spirit as you utter your prayers of "Thank You." Sunday worship and gatherings continue to inspire and enliven our spiritual thankfulness. I give thanks for all of this and so much more. We are to pronounce a gospel of freedom and life for all. We commit to our covenant of welcome and hospitality.

November is the perfect pause before winter arrives to remind us that our world is blessed with beauty, possibility, and love. If injury and illness are part of your daily challenge, or maybe it is emotional distress, I encourage you to turn to your spiritual and emotional foundations. A trusted friend, a faithful counselor, a compassionate confidante – better yet, your heavenly angels. Faith, hope, and love remain. And the greatest of these is love.

## **Board Meeting Minutes**

### First UCC Church Board Meeting Minutes Sept. 12, 2022 (In-Person & Zoom)

In attendance: Ruth Beck, June Bronnert, Darrell Copenhaver, Christy Dennis (Treasurer), Christine Guillory, Milt Hauck, Bill Henrich, Travis Mandery, Margie Spatz, Pastor Dan Weyand-Geise; Guest: Ed Bosse (Facilities); Excused: Kendra Pressley

- **I. Devotion:** Pastor Dan opened the meeting with prayer.
- II. Call to Order: June called the meeting to order.
- III. <u>Recording Secretary's Report</u> The August report will be emailed to Church Board members for approval.
- IV. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Christy): The August reports were accepted, and approval was given to pay September expenses.

Motion: Bill Second: Darrell

Accepted: All in favor

The Board welcomed Christy to her first in-person Church Board meeting. There was discussion about the process for paying special music expenses to be covered by the Music Fund. Musicians will be paid out of the General Fund by Christy, and reimbursed by Bill on behalf of the Music Fund. Christy reported that the insurance company will now charge for paper bills; there was agreement that she should set these up for online delivery. After discussion, it was agreed that checks made out to Christy for her services as treasurer should be written by another signer and that she may be the co-signer.

V. <u>Facilities Committee</u> (Ed): Ed reported that there are approximately 25 stumps on the church property that the Facilities Committee would like to have ground and removed. On a motion by Ruth, seconded by Darrell, the Church Board authorized Arbor Care to do this work at a cost of no more than \$1,800. Darrell will work with a free service to identify the location of underground utility lines prior to the work.

Ed shared that the storage area doors near the kitchen would not open prior to Sauerkraut Supper, and that he arranged for a friend to repair them. As a thank you, the Church Board will offer Ed's friend some free sausage leftover from the dinner.



## **Board Meeting Minutes**

Darrell reported that the convection oven has been malfunctioning, for which he has obtained a repair estimate of \$2,800. After discussion, the Church Board agreed that those who frequently use the oven (Fishes & Loaves and Senior Social) will be asked to investigate whether repair or replacement is in order. Pastor Dan will relay the message to those groups.

VI. Financial Secretary's Report (Darrell): The August report was accepted:

VII. Pastor's Report (Pastor Dan): Pastor Dan shared the following updates:

- Found House (formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network)
- CAIN First Church's next Phil's Place meal hosting will be Oct. 31, which
  occurs during months of the year in which a fifth Monday occurs. On a motion by
  Christine, seconded by Darrell, the Church Board agreed to increase the budget
  for each hosting to no more than \$300 (an increase from \$200). Susie Cairns
  coordinates these meals, which typically feed approximately 125 people. Pastor
  Dan also shared that he will be regularly volunteering as a greeter at Phil's place
  on Monday afternoons. He will share regular updates with the Church Board on
  his increased involvement.
- Welcoming New Members
- Sauerkraut Support
- Heartland Conference Pastor Dan will be attending the annual gathering in person in Columbus, and Jimmy Wiederhold plans to attend some portions online.

## VIII. Committee Reports

- By-laws & Constitution (Pastor Dan) Pastor Dan thanked Bruce Steinhard for
  his work to draft updates to the church's by-laws and constitution, which have not
  been updated since 1995. The draft document will be distributed to the Church
  Board in time to review and approve by early October. The document will be
  distributed to the congregation by email by Oct. 9 so that everyone will have two
  weeks to review before a vote to approve at the Oct. 23 Fall Congregational
  Meeting.
- Youth (Pastor Dan) The committee will be meeting with Jimmy soon to discuss fall and winter Youth programming plans. A suggestion was made that more frequent reports be presented to the Church Board from the Youth Committee.

## **Board Meeting Minutes**

- Mission (Pastor Dan) Pastor Dan reported that he will be meeting soon with a
  group from Christ's Community. At Washington UCC, Homework Club is
  starting up again. And, they are interviewing candidates for a new pastor.
- Health Ministry (Pastor Dan) The group continues to help church members as needed, including loaning equipment and with financial needs.
- Endowment (Bill) The current balance of the Endowment Fund is approximately \$4.7 million. The committee met recently, and performed an audit. Bill reported that the committee recently sold some stock in order to have more cash on hand. He suggested that the by-laws be updated to require bonding for members of the Endowment Committee (as is required for the treasurer). The group reiterated that a report of the Endowment Fund's balance and losses/gains should be presented to the Church Board and at Congregational Meetings twice a year.

#### IX. Old Business

• **Budget (Darrell)** – The Budget Committee will submit a proposed budget for the 2022-23 fiscal year to the Church Board at the October meeting, to be approved by the congregation at the Fall Congregational Meeting.

## X. New Business

Nominating Committee (June) – Four spots on the Church Board are up for renewal or new members in 2022. Terms are a 3-year commitment, which includes a monthly meeting (currently held in-person and by Zoom on the second Monday evening of the month). Church Board membership is open to those who have been a member of First UCC for at least a year. Those interested are encouraged to contact Gail Bauknecht, Pastor Dan, or June.
