

The Pastor's Report

Pastor Dan Weyand-Geise

There are still plenty of folks around here who remember my first sabbatical in the summer of 2006. There was apprehension and uncertainty on both of our parts as to what it meant for me to be away for nine weeks. We had just come through the Synod resolution of marriage equality in which I served on the committee that endorsed it. It was a shaky time in the life of the church. Families weren't coming as often; long-time members were aging and dying; our youth were busier than ever and less present. "Was pastor Dan looking to go elsewhere?" "Did the church still want this kind, but misguided pastor to lead them?" Yet, when I returned, our commitment to one another deepened. It was an exciting time in ministry here as our local mission work evolved and my role in the interfaith community began to emerge. We had just celebrated our 150th year as a congregation; my time in Africa set the course for our participation with Global Partners. We were listening and responding to the Spirit.

Eight years later, my daughter Maddie was going to college. The church had again survived a bit of a crisis when there were some serious rifts regarding race, sexuality, and the sharing of our space with neighbors. Again, the sabbatical seemed to come at just the right time. I used the time to transition into a new stage of life not only with my family, but also as an established pastor here and in ministry overall. I stayed in D.C. and camped in Pennsylvania for July, August, and the start of September. First UCC rededicated itself to the Our Whole Lives program; we began to study what it meant to be an Open and Affirming congregation; we reimagined worship with music and the messages. Congregants were invited to visit other churches; I picked the brain of pastors who had served more than 15 years at their congregation and heard what made it successful and what pitfalls to notice. Again, upon my return, there was celebration and life in new ways with the ministry here and with my pastoral care and education. I took on the role as president of MARCC, then as moderator for SONKA. These connections served us well as First Church deepened our IHN ministry, Fishes and Loaves ministry, youth program, and local partnerships such as at Washington UCC. We would soon have our largest confirmation class in decades. It was an exciting time in our life together.

As with my two previous sabbaticals, I trust that this will be a fruitful time for both you and me. Two decades have rolled by us. I remain in awe and wonder of the Holy works in and through our lives here at First UCC. Thanks be to God. And God will be with us 'til we meet again. Amen.
