From the Desk of the Mayor

2018 was a busy and exciting year in Nutter Fort.

One noticeable thing that happened last fall was the beginning of the town's paving project. Thanks to the paving fee, we were able to do over \$300,000 in paving to some of our more than 11 ½ miles of city streets.

We will also be beginning a major sewer improvement project. This is phase II of what began several years ago. This is a project mandated by the DEP to keep us in compliance. A lot of our sewer lines were installed decades ago and have been failing for many years. As part of this project, a lot more street paving will be done.

We have been blessed with some new businesses, Black and White Ice Cream, Applehouse CBD, LoCasto Music, Almost Heaven Harley Davidson, Speedway Appliance, and In A Flash Heating and Cooling to name a few. We are working tirelessly on filling the few vacant buildings left in town.

Longtime business, Bonnie Belles is doing a major expansion of their facility. We are indeed thankful for their growth.

Recently the Exponent Telegram selected the best of Harrison County and eleven Nutter Fort businesses were awarded number one in their category, Skasik's, Ultimate Roofing, United Tile and Carpet, Wilson Martino Dental, Amos Carvelli, FOP Restaurant, Wesbanco Bank, Bonnie Belles, Thelma's Lunch, Head Quarters, and Julie Garvin Law. In the people and profession category Bo Oliverio and Julie Garvin were selected number one. Several others in Nutter Fort placed either 2nd or 3rd, including Advance Auto, Rush Tire, In A Flash Plumbing Heating and Cooling, Clarksburg City Park, BC Bank, Harrison County Bank, Audia's Restaurant, Out of the Way Pet Grooming, The Spirit Shoppe, Mother Goose Land, Steve Pinti, Kevin Magee, JR of JR's Chop Shop, Nathan Rohrbough, and Mark Pinti. We are proud of all of these and are glad they are part of our town.

After 43 years of service, Homer Moore has retired. Homer has driven our trash truck for many years and was a familiar face in town. We wish him the best as he enjoys his much-deserved retirement.

Governor Justice has signed into law, SB4 which makes Home Rule permanent in West Virginia. We are working with our attorney in preparation of becoming a Home Rule City. This new status will open a lot of doors for us as a municipality in improving the quality of life for our citizens. Nearby Clarksburg and Bridgeport have been Home Rule cities for a few years and their people have benefited greatly.

Thanks to our dedicated and talented staff, Nutter Fort is, by far, the best place to live and do business.

**NUTTER FORT POLICE DEPARTMENT
INFORMATION FROM THE CHIEF**

The police department purchased two new vehicles in March of 2019. The new vehicles are replacing two that are ten years old. We will be auctioning the two older vehicles soon. PLEASE KEEP AN EYE ON THE FACEBOOK PAGE FOR MORE INFORMATION.

The department was awarded the gold award for the work was done on traffic safety in 2018 sponsored by AAA. This is the 9th year in a row that we have received this award. We will continue to work traffic in our community to make the roads safer for everyone.

The police department is working hard to keep up with the growing amount of calls involving drugs. We are seeing more and more calls related to heroin and Meth.

The police department will be going around and checking properties and streets for dead storage vehicles. We will be issuing tickets and towing vehicles and owners will be required to appear before the police judge. If you have a vehicle that is dead storage, please remove it immediately. If your neighbor has a dead storage vehicle or you know where one is located, you can report that to us on our FACEBOOK PAGE or by calling the office and we will follow up on that information as soon as possible.

If you have seasonal type vehicles, boats, campers, RVs, ATVs Etc. please DO NOT park them on the street and leave them for an extended period of time. This causes a problem with parking. Be respectful of your neighbors.

If you have a dog or cat, please keep them on your own property. Make sure you have rabies tags and tax tags for your animals. We will be checking, and citations will be issued.

Please keep your vehicle locked at all times and do not keep anything of value in your vehicle. Subjects will walk up and down the street and check for easy targets.

The department is always working Governor Highway Safety Grants and looking for violations of cell phone use, seatbelt use, speed enforcement and driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

You will be seeing officers patrolling the residential neighborhoods at night using the alley lights etc. in their cruiser. I have heard from a lot of elderly people in town who really like this because it makes them feel safe.

Springtime is upon us so please pay attention in the residential areas for children playing and riding bikes. We also ask that you watch your speed as we will be running radar. And remember to watch for stop signs.

The park is now open, and baseball is being played on all the fields. The park is very busy so we will be patrolling and looking for any problems. As a reminder, alcohol use is NOT allowed in the park and the park closes at dark.



Public Works Department Notes

As a reminder, all homes must be equipped with a water shut-off valve inside the home per WV State Code §150-7-5. In part, the code states that the customer shall install and properly maintain in good working condition a stop and waste cock of a type approved by the utility on the customer's service pipe immediately inside the foundation wall in a readily accessible location and in a place protected from the possibility of freezing and so placed that it will shut off and drain all plumbing within any and all buildings in the premises.

Following these simple guidelines could save you, the homeowner, thousands of dollars in home repairs from future water leaks.

Street cleaning will be taking place this summer. There will be some parking interruptions during this process. Notices will be delivered 24hrs. prior to your street being cleaned.

Our 2019 sewer project is coming along. Bids should be out towards the end of the summer and construction should begin in the fall.

In response to the multiple requests from residents, we have decided to add yard waste to our chipper service. This will now be on a regular schedule and will coincide with our recycling every second and fourth Wednesday. Residents must call Town Hall to schedule pickup.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

BUILDING PERMITS – Please check with Town Hall to see if a permit is required prior to starting improvements to your property. Permits are not required for flooring, painting or minor landscaping unless a contractor or handyman will be performing the work. For your own security and peace of mind, contact Town Hall to verify that a prospective contractor is registered every time you plan on hiring out a job.

BURNING PERMITS – There is a \$5.00 fee to obtain a burning permit. The fire must always be attended to. The area must be cleared down to mineral soil for a minimum distance of 10 feet around items to be burned & if your fire escapes, you are liable for the costs of fighting the fire & any damage the fire may cause. \$1000.00 is the maximum fine for violating the burning law.

CHIPPER/YARD WASTE LIST – To better serve our citizens, Public works will be starting a **REGULAR** schedule for the pickup of both yard waste and chipping. Yard waste is **NOT** to be picked up with regular municipal waste per the Solid Waste Authority. This service will start in May and will follow the recycling dates. Residents will need to call Town Hall to be added to the list for pickup. This service will be done at **NO ADDITIONAL COST** to our residents, If you have questions, please contact Town Hall at (304)622-7713

BULK ITEM DISPOSAL – If you find yourself with an item that is not picked up by your Garbage crew because it exceeds our restrictions, please feel free to call Leroy Armstead at 304.669.0540 or 304.695.8976 and discuss a pick-up arrangement. There may be a small fee.

LED SIGN RENTAL – Please keep in mind that the Town Hall LED sign is available to the general public to display announcements, i.e. birthdays, anniversaries and important events. The fee is \$25 on the 1st day and \$10 for each additional day thereafter.

PARKING LOT RENTAL – If you are having an event at Kuz's Korner, the parking lot can be rented for \$25. We also offer a special discounted package of parking lot rental and one day sign rental for \$45.

SAFETY – SMOKE DETECTORS & CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

If you missed changing the batteries in your smoke detectors on March 10 for daylight savings time, please take a moment to do so. Smoke detectors save lives! Also, make sure that every member of your family is familiar with an ESCAPE plan, in case of a fire. *In addition to smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors are also instrumental in preventing poisoning or death from carbon monoxide exposure.* These items can be obtained at a very low cost and could save your life and the lives of your family! WEST VIRGINIA STATE BURNING LAWS

In accordance with West Virginia State Code and the WV Division of Forestry, beginning March 1 and continuing through May 31, you are only permitted to burn outdoors from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. This is to help prevent the unwanted spread of fire during the dry spring season. You must also contact the Town of Nutter Fort to obtain a burning permit if you wish to burn brush at your residence.

12 Ways to Conserve Water at Home

1- Evaluate your water habits.

Do you leave the water on while brushing your teeth? Do you take extra-long showers?

2- Look for leaks- and repair them right away.

Check faucets and pipes for dripping water. Replace washers and replace/repair fixtures, if needed.

*Add food coloring to the tank and check toilet bowl in 15 minutes. (Don't flush) If there is color in the bowl, there is a leak.

3- Install water-saving devices.

- Aerators
- Low flow fixtures
- Tank displacement devices (Make sure all are properly installed)

4- Save water while preparing food.

- Use brush and bowl to clean food instead of letting the water run.
- Thaw frozen food in your refrigerator or microwave, not under running water.
- Reuse water when you can. Cooking water for vegetable can be used as water for soup stock.

5- Flush the toilet only when necessary.

(Don't use the toilet to dispose of trash.)

6- Know the proper settings on your washer.

When buying a washer, be sure it has such features as:

- A load size selector or automatic load sensor
- Variable water temperature controls

7- Wash dishes wisely.

8- Be efficient in the shower and bath.

- Plug the drain before running water for baths
- Shut off water while soaping up and shampooing.

9- Use less water to clean your home.

- Use a pail or basin instead of running water

10- Check hoses and irrigation systems.

Use a hose nozzle that you can shut off or adjust to a fine spray.

- Check hoses and connectors
- Consider a drip irrigation system.
- Keep irrigation systems running efficiently.

11- Minimize watering outdoors.

- Water when the sun is down (to avoid evaporation) and when it's not windy.
- Let grass grow taller in hot weather. Use mulch to save moisture.
- Plant shrubs and other plants that don't need a lot of watering.
- Obey any watering restrictions in your community.

12- Keep up with pool and hot tub care.

Utility Bills

The amount that is in red is the amount due if the bill is paid on or before the due date of the 5th of each month. The amount on the right is the past due amount of the bill.

ALL bills are sent out by the 15th of each month and are due by the 5th of the following month unless the 5th falls on a weekend, then they are due the next weekday the office is open.

Online Payments

You now have the option to pay water bills online through PSN. (Payment Service Network) There is still a \$3.00 fee for payments using this service.

Late Payments

If you are unable to pay your bill, and you would like to avoid a shut-off or a shut-off notice, you have the option to set up a deferred payment plan. The payment plan can extend to the last day of the month in which the payment is due.

Shut-Off

If your water gets shut-off for non-payment, the full past due amount must be paid with a \$50.00 reconnect fee before your water service can be reconnected.

****Please remember it is illegal to get into your meter well. If you need any assistance, the Public Works Department would be more than happy to assist you. Thank you.**
