Shaded parshiot are a double portion for that week.

There are 54 Torah portions, one for each week of a leap year. During the year, starting and ending on Simchat Torah, the entire Torah is read during services. During normal years, there are 50 weeks, so some portions are doubled (a leap-year adds an additional month (4 weeks) to the normal 12 (Adar I is the added month, Adar becomes Adar II in leap years). During the weeks of Passover and Sukkot, different Torah portions are read, so for leap years there are 52 weeks for the 54 readings (2 weeks have double Torah portions), and for normal years there are 50 weeks for the 54 readings (4-7 weeks have double Torah portions). Torah portions, like Moadim, are as they are in Israel without the extra days added in the Diaspora. Shavuot is not given a Shabbat (as it is in the Diaspora-causing Chukat & Balak to become a double portion).

Torah Readings shown are from most Jewish bibles. Chapters and verses with other versions and translations do not necessarily coincide. Verses in parentheses are alternate numbering exemplars from some Christian translations.

**Boldface** Moedim are Scriptural, the rest are traditional holidays, not Moedim.

**Moedim start at sundown the night before the dates shown (i.e. Pesach starts at sundown on Wednesday April 1, 2026).**

Jewish tradition has added extra days to many Moedim (8 days instead of seven for Passover/Unleavened Bread, 2 days instead of 1 for Rosh Hashanah and Shavuot, etc.), based on the once practical matter that it took many days to spread the word regarding when Rosh Chodesh (the new moon and the first of the month) occurred. This caused delays/confusion in the appointed times for other Moedim since they are based on the first of the month in which they occur. Extra days were therefore added to try and compensate. Thanks to technology this practice is no longer necessary. Since it also goes against Scripture's admonishment not to add to or take away from G-d's Word, the original length of the Moedim are followed here, not man's traditions. This calendar also starts the counting of the Omer the day after the weekly Sabbath during Pesach/Matzah, not the day after Pesach/1 Matzah. Since there is no Sabbath 50 days after Pesach except the weekly Sabbath, counting from the day after the weekly Sabbath is the only method that fulfills all of Scripture (see Leviticus 23:15-16). The reader will also note that Sh'mini Atzeret and Simchat Torah are on the same day, as they are celebrated in Israel today, rather than on sequential days as is the common practice in the Diaspora.
