Don't miss anything because it's all GOOD!

Fire Chief Rodriguez spoke with the Coconino County Emergency Manager yesterday to confirm that fire restrictions will remain in effect for the Forest Lakes subdivision. He understands the zone issue with us being surrounded by Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest, that is not under restrictions, but the County ordinance is directed at the Coconino National Forest and Kaibab National Forest, who still have high fire danger. So ... **no campfires until probably after the holiday.**

Who would have thought that by this time in the Summer season, **we'd still need to be observing closures due to CDC Guidelines?** Here is a reminder of our local services and buildings that are still closed for public use. These include the Fire Station, the Water District, the School District Building, and the Community Center (exception - Rummage Sale over Labor Day week-end).

THE DAY WE'VE ALL BEEN WAITING FOR!! NEW VERIZON CELL TOWER IS NOW PROVIDING FULL SERVICE!!

The new monopine cell tower, located on Fire Department property, was activated on Wednesday, August 26th that allowed engineers to make necessary adjustments between towers.

Two things Verizon customers should experience are a reduction of dropped calls and more clarity. The Labor Day weekend will determine if Verizon services will be able to handle the increased volume that comes with a holiday weekend. Fiber optics is the main source of the signal.



A REMINDER: The tower is privately owned, land is leased to the tower owner by the fire district and the tower company then leases space to cell phone providers. At this time, Verizon is the only company that is leasing space.

If your phone service hasn't seemed to improve, try turning it on to Airplane Mode and then off again and your phone will search for the nearest signal. You can also try doing a "Restart".

If you have an older phone with 2G or 3G service, your phone might not be able to sync with the new tower that offers 4G. If you're looking for an opportunity to spend some of that extra money you've been able to save (COVID money!), now's your chance to upgrade. Verizon offers low cost 4G compatible phones for around \$100. Check them out!

The "no-no" debris has been removed from the pile, and loads can be accept once again.

REMEMBER: No rebar, metal of any kind including nails, screws and fasteners along with construction debris as these items have torn the conveyer belt of the chipping equipment, resulting in significant down time and it becomes very

expensive to repair.

As the grinder is processing the green waste, a magnet will capture some of the smaller metal items and disperse it on the ground. It is difficult for the operators to collect this debris to eliminate flat tires on trucks, trailers and our front end loader.

We urge you to check twice before loading materials that will be delivered to the GWTS, so that it does not have any foreign items. As we've said many times: "There is no such thing as a square tree".

Thanks again for helping keep the community as safe as possible by clearing your lots in the event of a wildfire.

FYI: The source of the latest debris has not been found at this time. A couple of nice residents offered to clean up and haul away the materials that are not acceptable so that we can all get back to using the site. Thank you to whoever you are!

Did you know that you can take non-green materials to the Transfer Station in Overgaard for a modest fee! Something to keep in mind when you have any trash that you want to get rid of.

NOTE the shortened hours on Mondays and Fridays, due to the lower number of loads being brought to the site by this time of the year.


