FL Fire District Report From Chief Dave Rodriquez Update on the Cell Tower

A work order has been issued for boring to bring a fiber optics line to the cell tower site. This work should be completed in the next 7 to 10 days allowing engineers to begin connecting and testing of the installed equipment. I am being informed the tower will be operational by the end of August.

NEW: Microgrid Project

Arizona Public Service [APS] and the Forest Lakes Fire District are exploring a partnership for the lease of Fire District property to build a Microgrid power system that will provide back-up power to the community in the event of a power failure. Jim Piotrowski, Director of Distributed Energy Resources Operations & Maintenance for APS presented the concept at Saturday's fire board meeting. In the event of a power outage, this Microgrid energy site would provide the entire community with power.

The fire board voted unanimously to explore the feasibility of such a partnership that would benefit the community and provide income to the district via a long term lease. The property directly behind the new fire station next to the temporary cell tower is large enough for the proposed project and is being considered. APS representatives and Chief Rodriquez will be working on preliminary site layout and design features that will minimize the impact to the surrounding neighbors. If all goes as planned, the Fire District Board of Directors will review and approve the site plan at next month's board meeting.

Project completion goal is end of 2021.

Forest Lakes Fire District Auxiliary Report

Due to social distancing, we have cancelled our July Auxiliary meeting. Any Auxiliary events, which include our Fourth of July activities, have been canceled until further notice.

Casa Rey's Food Truck will be returning to Forest Lakes - dates to be announced in the near future. To everyone who has purchased food from them in the past, the Auxiliary would like to thank you. Remember, a portion of their proceeds is being donated to the Forest Lakes Fire District Auxiliary. We greatly appreciate Casa Rey's support.

Last month the Auxiliary announced that the Fire Board requested a donation towards a Lucas Chest Compressor for the Fire District (see picture below), with an approximate cost of \$15,000.00. Here is information provided to our Board by Forest Lakes Fire District Chief David Rodriquez on how this piece of equipment will benefit our team of First Responders: "With our crews on high alert and additional safety precautions in place due to COVID-19, our hand to body interactions increase our emergency staffs exposure to not only COVID-19, but all other communicable diseases. This Lucas device has been around for a couple of years and studies have indicated a higher survivability rate for patients that experienced sudden cardiac arrest. Having this component in our toolbox provides a force multiplier due to our smaller response model, frees up personnel to provide adequate airway management and allows the sometimes single paramedic to administer Advanced Cardiac Life Support medications in a timely manner. The device will reduce our hand to body exposure once applied, increasing circulation that is critical with full cardiac arrests."

We would like to thank those who have so generously contributed towards the Lucas Chest Compressor. We can still use your help. We are continuing to reach out to the Forest Lakes community. Do you know that when you make a donation to the Forest Lakes Fire District Auxiliary, that donation can be tax deductible? Do you also know that when you make a donation to the Auxiliary that is earmarked for a specific need, i.e., the Lucas Chest Compressor, that donation goes directly to that purchase? Just wanted to send you a quick notice letting you know we plan to spray FR 99 from HWY 260 to FR 99A with Mag-Chloride on Tuesday, July 7, 2020. This treatment is designed to reduce the dust impact from logging trucks on homes in Forest Lakes. The treatment process will take a couple hours, during which time, that section of FR 99 will be closed to all traffic. The contractor has not given us an exact time of day for the closures but should have signs posted during the work.

Officials closing Tonto National Forest July 2nd

PHOENIX, June 30, 2020 Wildfires that have burned more than 224,500 acres this year on the Tonto National Forest. Ongoing extreme fire danger due to dry conditions and hot temperatures following a wet winter that produced an abundance of dry brush and grass, have led Tonto officials to close the state's largest national forest beginning at 6 a.m. on July 2.

"We are currently seeing record setting fire danger conditions and new fire starts have become increasingly difficult to control. This closure represents the best option at this time to deal with these conditions, and both reduce risk to the public and protect their forest lands for the future." Taiga Rohrer, Tonto National Forest Fire Management Officer said. "Additionally, it is extremely important that people travelling along highways through these areas ensure that their vehicles and trailers are in good condition and tow chains are properly secured to avoid causing roadside fires."

The Stage 3 Forest Closure means that all National Forest System lands contained

within the Tonto are closed to the public. CLICK HERE to read the entire press release that includes exceptions of open areas and roads.

FYI

Forest Lakes is located in the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest and is not included in this closure. However, the No Burn restrictions are still in effect for Apache-Sitgreaves and Forest Lakes.

The Tonto National Forest boundary lines are to the West and South of Woods Canyon Lake.



COCONINO COUNTY ACTS TO REQUIRE FACE COVERINGS WHEN SOCIAL DISTANCING IS NOT POSSIBLE - THIS APPLIES TO FOREST LAKES.

Coconino County issued a proclamation on Friday, June 19th, requiring residents and visitors to wear a face covering when not able to physical distance themselves from other persons.

The proclamation, effective on Saturday, June 20 at noon, applies to all private lands in the unincorporated areas of the County. The County proclamation does not affect areas within cities or towns in the County or on federal, state or tribal lands.

"Wearing a face covering when around others is one of the single most effective ways to help slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community," said Coconino County Chairwoman Liz Archuleta. "Each of us can help to prevent COVID-19 transmission by wearing a face covering when we cannot physically distance from others. Please do your part and model best practices by putting on your face covering when you are out in public and around other people. This is one thing we can do to take care of ourselves and neighbors."

In accordance with CDC guidance, all individuals older than 2 years old must wear a face covering while within the unincorporated areas of Coconino

County under the following circumstances:

When in a public indoor space if another person is present.

When in public outdoor spaces if another non-household person is less than 6 feet away.

When in the public areas of any business or government building. When waiting in line indoors and outdoors.

Face coverings will not be required for children under the age of 2 years old, or anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance. Face coverings will not be required when at home, while eating or drinking, while swimming, while working alone in a workplace when six feet of physical is present, when alone in vehicle or in a vehicle with household members, or when exercising alone or with household members.

The County encourages residents and visitors to continue to follow best practices and guidance to prevent COVID-19 transmission including staying home when sick, not gathering in large numbers, maintaining physical distance of at least 6 feet apart from others and washing or sanitizing your hands frequently. Combining these practices with wearing a face covering will greatly help to slow the spread of COVID-19.
