REMINDER OF WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE

Coconino County Ordinance #2017-11 prohibits parking at all times along County maintained rights-of-way between November 1 and April 1 and allows for the civil enforcement of parking restrictions either by citation (not less than \$200 fine) or towing. This ordinance is intended to help reduce the detrimental effects of snow play, and keep all county roads clear of vehicles for road

maintenance employees when there is snow that needs to be removed. THANK YOU for complying.

FOREST LAKE FIRE DISTRICT Board Opening

At our Board meeting held October 19, our friend and colleague of seven years, Quentin Tolby, announced his resignation from the Forest Lakes Fire District Board of Directors. Quentin indicated he wants to spend more dedicated time with his wife and family.

Quentin's term expires November 30, 2020. Therefore, it is incumbent on the Board to appoint a replacement to fill the remainder of his term and we are seeking Forest Lakes Community members who have interest to apply for this opportunity. Residents who wish to be considered for appointment must be registered voters of the fire district. Switching registration is easy and can be accomplished on-line.

Serving on this Board requires that you attend monthly meetings (required by law), come prepared for these meetings by reviewing pre-distributed documents, participating in discussions and voting on motions. Excluding travel and any special assignments, this role requires about 5 hours per month. Quentin's replacement, like the rest of us, will be a public official, appointed to fill Quentin's remaining two-year term rather than elected. Note that as a public official, this is a volunteer, unpaid position.

The individual we are looking for should have a professional background, be diligent in performing their duties, get along with others in a team environment, have appreciation for the role the Fire District plays in maintaining public safety in our community, be able to devote the needed time and be available to attend the monthly meetings. Meetings can be attended telephonically.

One other requirement is attendance at the annual Arizona Fire District Association Conference, a training and networking event, held each January, in Laughlin.

Expenses are paid for the board member and you may bring a guest, but their expenses are not covered.

Currently we have four male board members. While anyone who considers themselves qualified may apply, we especially encourage women to get involved. Your perspective would be welcomed and is encouraged.

Our Fire District is in very good shape. We have a strong leadership team and we are well positioned operationally, strategically and financially. Therefore, we encourage you to bring your skills to help us run this important community resource.

NEWS WORTH REPEATING ... PROGRESS REPORT ON VERIZON TOWER

The Forest Lakes Fire Station Cell Tower Pre-construction Kick-off Meeting was held at 10 am on Thursday, October 17th, at the fire station. Chief Dave Rodriquez, Fire Board Chairman Tom Cummiskey, Director of Operations for High Desert Communications Rusty Lewellen, and Ken Jacobs of Northland Research Inc., who is the project manager, were in attendance.

Groundbreaking will be November 4th as all building permits have been approved and issued. Mr. Lewellen stated if all goes as planned, it will take approximately 8 weeks to complete. High Desert Communications is the tower construction company. The tower will look like a pine tree and be 150 feet in height. There will be a support building as part of the project that will be of masonry construction. It will have a metal roof with color match of the current fire department facilities.

The first cell phone provider to occupy space on the tower will be Verizon. Verizon anticipates a spring time installation for their equipment. Once installed, Verizon will test and go live soon after.
