Ready for more snow in Forest Lakes and the high country?? This report just in from the National Weather Service in Flagstaff.....

A complex weather pattern is set to impact northern Arizona beginning this afternoon around 3 PM.

Widespread precipitation will continue through today, especially south of the Mogollon Rim. Snow could mix in at times as low as 6,500-7,000 feet. We can expect periods of heavy rainfall, accumulating snow, gusty winds, and increased flows on waterways.

A second, colder system will begin tonight with increased precipitation coverage and intensity through Wednesday morning. Snow levels will fall quickly overnight. Precipitation will diminish after midday Wednesday.

Snowfall amounts above 7000 feet could be at least 2 feet.

Warm and dry conditions are predicted through the weekend.
