

#### YOU CAN HAVE NEW & ABUNDANT LIFE!

Jesus said, "The time has come. . .The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!" (Mark 1:15 NIV)

And again, "I have come so that they may have life, and have it more abundantly." (John 10:10)

That includes you!

As recorded in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."

To have that abundant and eternal life simply, "Repent" or "turn" to God and believe the good news of Jesus Christ. You can do this in your heart by asking God's forgiveness of your sins (thoughts and actions which separate you from God's love and holiness).

A suggested prayer is: "Dear Jesus, forgive my sins and come into my heart. I receive you as my Savior and Lord." If you have said such a prayer, you are encouraged to join in further fellowship and learning as a follower of Jesus. Speak with Pastor Sam or others for more ways to connect.
