God's Beautiful Creation (December 30, 2020 – Upper Room)

Read: Psalm 134:1-3

A song of ascents.

¹ Praise the LORD, all you servants of the LORD who minister by night in the house of the LORD.

² Lift up your hands in the sanctuary and praise the LORD.

³ May the LORD bless you from Zion, he who is the Maker of heaven and earth.

Read the December 30 installment in the Upper Room <u>Lesson background:</u> based on the above scripture

- > The Levites were servants of the Lord by office, appointed to minister in holy things; they attended to the sanctuary, and kept the charge of the house of the Lord
- The Levites made sure the lamps stayed lit and that the sanctuary stayed safe.
- Psalm 134 was prepared for the priests who served the sacred place by night. They were in danger of slumbering; and they were in danger of idle reverie.
- ➤ The Psalmist urges the priests to sustain the praises of God's house; let there be praise in Zion--still praise by night as well as by day!

Daily application from this lesson:

- When God *blesses us it means that he does good things to us.
- When we *bless God", as in this psalm, we say good things to God.
- We should always be blessing God throughout our day

- 1. Describe a time when you did something you were not accustomed to or did not want to do but that ended up finding great joy in?
- 2. What activities help you to fully enjoy and appreciate the beauty of God's creation?
- 3. When and where do you most often find peace and rest?
- 4. What does the beauty and wonder of God's creation teach you about God, yourself, and the world?

I will bless God with my praises for all His creation
