Change

PASTOR • I remember learning an expression in my childhood which described the month of March in our area. "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." It was of course referring to the great change from the blustery winds usually accompanying the beginning of the month, and the gentle breeze or calmer air towards the end of the month. Considering this winter has been so mild, and the apparently reality of climate change, I wonder what this month will bring as winter gives way to spring.

I believe most of us who live in regions where there are distinct changes in the seasons come to feel a sense of rhythm in nature and life. We rely on the changes, though we may prefer particular seasons over others. The change — and its regularity — is something we look forward to. We may feel something is missing if we have only a mild winter — or no winter at all!

So it is with changes in life. Whether it be the seasons of life itself (birth, childhood, youth, stages of adulthood, and death) or the many other changes of circumstances in life (relationships, vocation, location, etc.), change is a natural and necessary part of living and growing. But this reality also presents a paradox, in that "too much" change (within a short time) can be unsettling and disturbing.

In our spiritual life and in our growth as Christians, it helps to practice regular disciplines such as worship, Bible study, prayer and meditation, service, and conferring with other Christians. We often do these in particular ways.

But change is also a necessary part of the process if we hope to grow in our faith and its expressions. The Bible is filled with examples of individuals and groups of people, including the early disciples and later the church, who grew as a result of positive change.

Sometimes these changes were radical or drastic, as in ceasing harmful behaviors or associations with certain persons. At other times they were formed over time with repeated practice and devotion, as described above.

The good news is that in Jesus Christ change is made easier! Another way to make effective changes easier is to replace bad/harmful habits with good/healthy ones. The same can be said of personal relations with others in sharing or demonstrating God's love in our world. The season of Lent is an especially appropriate time to reflect on the changes affecting us or which need to be made in ourselves, and ask Christ to help us and others grow by them.



home. There are nine questions about each person living in the home. All responses are kept strictly confidential. They are not allowed to give information about anyone and any private or government agency. This year, the Census Bureau will also be offering to respond online or by toll free telephone number.

Responding to the Census is very important. The population statistics determine the amount of federal and state funding that comes to Cecil County. This has a direct effect on schools, libraries, and many federal program that help our families such as Medicaid, WIC, SNAP and CHP.

The number of residents helps to ensure that Cecil County has adequate services such as public health, public safety and emergency planning.

In 2010, more than 25% of Cecil County residents did not participate in the Census. As a result, Cecil County lost \$1,800 for each person who was not counted.

Please help our community by ensuring that your family is counted in the 2020 Census.
