Dear Family & Friends of CCUMC,

As mentioned previously, a task force to consider options and plans for gathering and reopening our church buildings is underway.

For the sake of consistency during our pastoral transition, the Task Force for Return to Gathering at CCUMC is being led by our Church Council Chairperson, Gwenn Barteld. After meeting Tuesday night, the following has been decided thus far: *Given the extensive restrictions for gathering for* worship inside our church buildings (including ... a *limited number of persons permitted at any time not* to exceed 50% of maximum occupancy, maintaining a distance of at least 7 feet between individuals or family groups; wearing face masks; taking non-contact temperature at the door (preferred) or at home; coming and going from different doors, and dismissing by rows; refraining from congregational singing; sanitizing contact surfaces before and after worship; cleaning bathrooms after each use; ensuring that sick congregants, or those exposed to someone who is sick, remain at home for at least two weeks) the committee agreed that it is not feasible at this time. Other options, such as "in car" worship, were considered as well. Given the felt needs and restrictions, it was determined that Sunday worship will be online only through the month of June.

We hope to move the Sunday online worship location to one of our church buildings in July and feel strongly that an online service needs to continue.

Also realizing that the sense of community is missed by some with an online format, we plan to proceed with some opportunities to safely gather for caring conversation, praver and devotions. So, while gathering will look different for now, it will fill a need moving ahead.

PLEASE SEE THE FOLLOWING INVITATION ...

There will be an Evening Prayer Service, Wednesday June 17th at 7:00 pm (rain date June 18th) gathering on the lawn of Town Point.

This evening will be B.Y.O.E. (Bring your own everything): chair, mask, sanitizer, etc. We will form squares of 10 persons along the front lawn; each will have a team member to help facilitate, beginning with a time of sharing within each group. I will speak from the front steps of Benner Hall, with a brief scripture devotion and prayer. We also plan to have some music provided. (Continues...)

Greetings dear friends!

Here we are entering the sixth month of the year, and like the beautiful flowers blooming in the fields, we are experiencing re-birth in The CCEA. Our pantry numbers have been lower than anticipated, so we have made every effort to explore why. In one day, I spent 3.5 hours making an effort to personally contact a large list of clients we had not seen or heard from since our March closing. In that day, we scheduled 9 clients who were not aware that we are open, though the method of service has changed slightly.

The volunteer team serving the pantry at this time, thought transportation might be an issue for others. So in the last weeks of May, started a dedicated effort to explore who those clients might be and to create an added service of "Knock & Drop", whereby volunteers will deliver pantry boxes to the door of these clients on a appointed date and within an appointed time range. Immediately after planning this, we identified our first client in need of this service...his name had been brought up by all of the volunteers. Calls had been made during the contact marathon, but he had not answered. Bill Campbell took on the task of reach out again, and we learned this client had broken his hip around Easter. Neighbors are providing support as he returns home, and he will be our first "knock & drop". I tell share this, because I invite YOU, THE READERS to help serve as our eyes & ears within the community. If you know someone who might benefit from the pantry serviceswhether using the curb-side service at the Complex or needing knock and drop-PLEASE invite them to call us and we'll do the rest.

I also want to share just how important these pantry boxes are to our clients. We received a lovely thank you note from Flo (last name omitted for client's confidentiality) and it reads, "My sincere & heartfelt thanks for the wonderful boxes you have shared with me. With less groceries on my list, I can now buy all my medications. I really appreciate you all! May God watch over you and keep you safe."

The choice faced by Flo, is one many of our clients face. It is a choice not limited to seniors, though most experienced perhaps by that age group. Families must choose between rent, utilities, food, and the unexpected major expenses "life interrupt-us" throws at us. And pride, fear and judgement are often the culprits that keep those most in need from asking. YOU can help us to reach them, by providing encouragement and invitation..."we are the judgement free zone for services, in times of need.

Clothing & Home Pantry:

We are diligently working on how to re-open the Home/ Clothing Pantry. Karyn Huddleston and the team will be working on the transition from Fall/Winter to Spring/ Summer over the month ahead. When we re-open, hopefully in July, we will likely be doing so "by appointment" and limiting access to the lower level by limiting the number of people at one time; initiating the masks or no entry policy; and limiting the actual appointment time to about 15 minutes per client. Teacher of Bohemia Manor Middle/High School Deliver! Special Thank You to a local business supporter: I would also like to thank Ed Boas, International Computer Assoc., right here in Chesapeake City for his continued support, time, talent and generosity. He provides Eileen with tech support and in general is "one of the behind the scenes" volunteers who gives far more than most of us are aware of..THANK YOU is not enough, but is spoken with heartfelt gratitude!

The support provided by Ed and many of the businesses right here in Chesapeake City, in addition to the continued support of private donors, even in our "new mode of operation", is a part of what allows us to keep moving forward as "the bridge" during times of crisis. So I close my June letter with a grateful and blessed heart!

Until next month, know that you are all held in my prayers, our prayers and HIS hands.
