



Chesapeake City, MD 21915 If you are in the vicinity of the Complex at 227 Basil Avenue, Chesapeake City, volunteers are *typically* there on Mondays and Tuesdays from 9:00 a to 11:30a and you are welcome to drop them off in person. As noted in the announcement you must use your Rewards Card at the register and tapes may not be altered in any way (please do not cut; mark up, etc.) and the date of the tape must be within the last 12 months (we highly recommend 9 months or less to ensure they are still good by the time we receive and process them). The simple act of using your card, saving your tapes and sending them in makes more difference than you realize when the tapes are added to the others received.





Dear Redner Receipts participants,

Following these guidelines can help ensure that your organization (CCEA) will receive their checks in a timely manner.

- Customer must use their Pump Perks/1% Save-A-Tape card for purchase. This will be noted on the bottom of the receipt.
- Please submit the whole receipt. Partial receipts will not be considered.
- Please do not use a highlighter marker on your receipts, it can erase the totals.
- All receipts must be dated within one year prior to the date of submission.
- Receipts from fuel purchases at Redner's Quick Shoppes are not considered.

Money earned through this program helps to fund the CCEA food pantry in purchasing perishable and non-perishable food.

Karyn Huddleston has been a valuable volunteer in the Clothing & Home Pantry. She has served tirelessly, while dealing with cancer. Her energy, infectious smile and savvy have added much. With her July report to the General Board, Karyn has presented her notice to step down from the Ministry Lead. Karyn wishes to continue serving as her time permits. She is managing the Old Gray Mare and currently her hours there do not leave her the time and dedication she would like to give. Stop in see Karyn at the store and wish her well.

Rev. Sam Mitchell is the new pastoral leader for The Chesapeake City UMC. He has taken residency in the church parsonage in Brantwood, and, shortly after arriving took the time to visit with us at The CCEA Complex. He hopes to give volunteer hours as he is able and we will welcome his leadership, youth and vitality.

Beth Ohline, a member of CCUMC, is learning the ropes of the Clothing and Home Pantry. With so many of our volunteers practicing "stay-at-home" or limited exposure, the addition of a new volunteer to serve in one of our most impacted ministries-at the same time as Karyn is stepping down-can only be a "God moment" for us.

Aidan Healy is a college student, who contacted us about volunteering with us this summer. Like mosquitoes in search of new blood, we jumped at the chance to welcome him and utilize his services. He has been a most willing student and aide to the Food Pantry team and to Eileen with the VBS social media aspects! His youth, vitality, and willingness to help where he has been needed has not gone without notice or our prayers of thanks.

Around the middle of July our Food Pantry team was surveyed on the possibility of opening with very limited restrictions beginning the first Tuesday in August. Then two of our key volunteer families were facing medical issues within their immediate families (thank you GOD neither COVID related). But our concern for the possibility of an asymptomatic guest coming in, gave us rise to stop and think further on the re-opening. While the number of families reached each month, has decreased, we believe those who need us most are coming via the appointment/curb-side delivery set-up. By a majority consensus of the team, we determined it best to continue operating under the appointment/curb-side delivery program.

We are also looking at other, limited ways we may be able to get food to families who don't know we are here. Knock & drop deliveries reached a few; helping to provide provisions for the Generation Station gift packages reached others and we will continue to be creative and make connections as the opportunities present.

What has not decreased is the generosity of our DONORS! Each week we are receiving deliveries. More of our donors are utilizing the "weekly needs listed", published on both our website at www.ccea4u.com and thru our social media page on Facebook. These targeted lists point to the gaps in our stock and YOU have been working to fill those gaps. We cannot thank you enough for your continued support.

Please take the time to read thru the rest of this month's newsletter for the most up to date reports. Because this newsletter is produced in the last week of the month, we do not have the statistics for The Rocky Railway VBS program. Preview clips that were viewed in advance of the launch were amazing! We sincerely hope that as the advertising announcements were posted on social media, that YOU our readers on Facebook shared the postings! We hope that in sharing, children far & wide will have the joy of boarding the railway and being introduced to Jesus thru great lessons and music that you'll be humming and singing for days after!

We now move into the 6th month of COVID operations, and the path forward is no less clear than when we started. Our Board Meetings have gone online and via e-mail when no voting is required, to ensure that the General Board is kept abreast of what is happening. We remain evergrateful to St. Basil's Ukrainian Catholic Church for the space in which we operate and their continued support and dedication to this organization; to the businesses and donors who have remained steadfast in these new waters we are charting and to YOU; to our member churches who support in ways great and small.
