




Ladies' Bible Study


MISSION OPPORTUNITY

October 27 - Home Goods especially blankets & sheets (twin, full and queen most requested.


November 24 - Winter clothing, including winter coats. Coats must be clean & display ready.

GROUP USE OF TOWN POINT

CCUMC has begun to permit the use of Town Point Church by small groups.

A reservation is required.

To reserve space for your group, please contact the church office to confirm availability and to receive the information & contract agreement packet via email.

In addition to our standard Use of Building Guidelines, additional guidelines have been established according to CDC and the State of Maryland's guidelines for best practices due to COVID-19.

Use of Building COVID-19 Guidelines

- All persons over the age of two (2) years who are present on CCUMC properties must always properly wear a mask. Masks
 must cover nose and mouth.
- Social distancing of six (6) feet <u>must</u> be maintained as outlined by the CDC and State of Maryland. Proper hygiene and hand sanitizing <u>must</u> be practiced intermittently throughout the gatherings.
- No food or drinks should be passed out or shared among non-household members.
- Zero contact should occur to the greatest extent possible among non-household members.
- If using indoor spaces all persons <u>must</u> use hand sanitizer upon entry.
- If using indoor spaces, all items which were moved <u>must</u> be replaced and sanitized.
- If using indoor spaces, including restrooms, all touched surfaces <u>must</u> be sanitized at the completion of your event.
- No one should be permitted entry who is exhibiting any signs of respiratory infection (coughing, sneezing, runny nose, etc.).
- No one should be permitted to attend any gathering after traveling out of the Delaware/Maryland area until 14 days have passed without symptoms.
- Complete attendance <u>MUST</u> be taken at <u>EVERY</u> gathering including names, phone numbers, and addresses of each person in attendance for Contact Tracing efforts and submitted to the CCUMC office for record-keeping.
- Contact Tracing records <u>must</u> be maintained for at least six (6) months and made available upon request by CCUMC, local law enforcement and/or health department officials.
