#### **EVERY CHILD MATTERS MOVEMENT**

When you read this, we will have been well past the date of this important event! However, the tragedies that led to the need for this and so many events like it has not passed and the task to locate several thousand missing children from the "Assimilation School Era" is only growing. While in North America the majority of the schools in question were in Canada and run under The Roman Catholic churches, other denominations are not without guilt and complicity. Assimilation schools (which later became the known as "reform" schools) were located in the lower 48-as close as Carlisle, PA.

#### Canada & US both recognizing September 30th - news from NABS:

"This year, the movement for boarding school healing is growing in a way it never has before and we are thrilled to see how many communities and organizations are planning events to honor boarding school survivors and bring awareness to the healing that needs to happen.

On September 30, we plan to honor a National Day of Remembrance for U.S. Indian Boarding Schools.

This aligns with the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation that is honored in Canada for residential school survivors.


It is also called Orange Shirt Day to honor the story of one girl whose treasured orange shirt given to her by her grandmother was taken away from her at residential school. The orange shirt has now come to symbolize awareness for the children who died or went missing at these institutions. We encourage everyone to wear orange shirts, raise awareness on that day to educate others, and attend or host community healing events."

To understand the full impact of the genocide inflicted, and yes the word genocide is wholly appropriate, I would encourage you to do some reading. The Every Child Matters Movement has provided a list of reading material-stories from survivors, stories from the families of the children lost and more. Below is the estimated number of children lost, and this number grows continuously as the permission is obtained to search the grounds on the 100s of schools involved.

For over two centuries we have fought over, abolished, and tried to come to grips with African American slavery. It is time for the West to confront an entirely separate, equally devastating

Unpacks the twenty-one most common myths and misconceptions about Native Americans In this enlightening book, scholars and activists Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz and Dina Gilio-Whitaker tackle a wide range of myths about Native American culture and history that have misinformed generations. Tracing how these ideas evolved, and drawing from history, the authors disrupt long-held and enduring myths such as: "Columbus Discovered America" "Thanksgiving Proves the Indians Welcomed Pilgrims" "Indians Were Savage and Warlike" "Most Indians Are on Government Welfare" "Indian Casinos Make Them All Rich" "Indians Are Naturally Predisposed to Alcohol". Each chapter shows how these myths are rooted in the fears and prejudice of European settlers and in the larger political agendas of a settler state aimed at acquiring Indigenous land and tied to narratives of erasure and disappearance.






