Finance Corner

As the end of the year approaches, we are all encouraged by the progress toward ending the long pandemic that has affected us all. We are also concerned about inflationary pressures that are causing all our day-to-day expenses to spiral upwards. Please consider that both the pandemic and inflation have a direct impact on our church. We have been blessed that even with the uncertainties of meeting in person, and the long periods when we could safely meet only electronically, the offerings have not been severely disrupted. It does appear that we will break even this year or come very close to it. As for inflationary pressures, the church is no different than our families or any business. The operational costs of the church are going up. We have an annual budget of approximately \$182,000. Of this amount, slightly more than \$91,000 is committed to salaries and benefits. An additional \$54,000 goes toward the operations and upkeep of our properties, and \$13,000 for the operation of the church office. The balance of the budget funds our outreach activities and apportionments to the United Methodist Church.

So, where does the money come from? The bulk of our income comes from us in the form of our regular offerings. We anticipate that in 2021 this will amount to \$160,000. The balance comes from various fund-raising activities, with that money earmarked for specific mission programs. For example, the proceeds from the Christmas Bazaar support youth and children missions. (Please note that the Trinity Pre-school is a self-supporting activity).

Throughout this year we have heard from parishioners who shared their reasons for coming to church, and why they have chosen to support our church. In October, we heard from members of our congregation during the offertory prayers of their interests in supporting the various missions of the church. As we begin a new year, please consider your continuing support of the church through a renewed commitment to stewardship of your tithes, talents and time.

May God continue to bless us and watch over us in 2022!




