GENERATION STATION

The Generation Station – Still Going after 22 Years

Most everyone has experienced disruption from the pandemic. The Generation Station is no exception. We've gone from closed altogether, to open for hybrid learning even though no parents felt safe enough to send their children, to fully open and nearly starting over.

Pre-pandemic attendance averaged 15-20 students per day. Most of those students had been coming for years. Since school has reopened nearly all of those students have aged out of the program or moved away. Nonetheless, the Generation Station Staff of Anita Collings and Gail Missimer have persevered to keep the program going and available for 6th-9th graders in the Bohemia Manor School District.

The reboot began this fall with just a few students. We now get three to five students a day, but they come regularly. We know that the homework help, character-building and enrichment activities, food and recreation help students to develop as responsible young adults. We will be here for them, and we know that we will serve increasing numbers of students as we emerge from the pandemic.

The Generation Station is a ministry of the Chesapeake City Ecumenical Association, which has provided guidance and support since its inception in 1999. It is sustained by the faithful support of the people, churches and organizations of southern Cecil County, as well as the United Way of Cecil County and occasional grants from the Cecil County Government. For example, we recently received a \$1,000 donation from the Chesapeake City check from VFW Post 7687 Auxiliary Memorial VFW Post 7687 Auxiliary. This truly is a community effort.

- Be responsible for coordinating the submission of Ministry status reports to the Board of Directors at every authorized meeting
- Handle the corporate correspondence of the organization and report on such at every authorized meeting


