Greetings friends!

Pastor Sam here, I pray everyone is enjoying the spring weather that is hopefully here to stay and surviving the onslaught of PASTOR pollen that comes with it. It is always a blessing to experience the changing of the seasons, the warming of days, the blooming of

the Earth, and to participate in the work of planning and preparation for summer. Though we are certainly excited for warmer weather and the fun that comes with it, I encourage everyone to remain in prayer for all those who continue to be infected or affected by the Covid-19 pandemic.

*Just a couple weeks ago we had the pleasure and privilege to celebrate* Easter Sunday. Often seen as the herald of spring, it is a day we celebrate the Resurrection and the new life Jesus brings into our own lives through the Spirit and through the change in seasons. It is well known that the time before Easter is known as Lent, a time of preparation and recommitment to the faith, leading to and culminating in our Easter celebrations with church and family. Less well known is the season after Easter, often called Eastertide, which is the 40 days after Easter. This is a time of joy where we continue to celebrate the newlife of Christ, but it is a celebration that calls us into action. Much like the season of Lent, Eastertide calls us to take on and live out the core of the Christian faith more fully.

Now that we have spent a season recalling the story of Jesus and the Disciples leading up to, and through, the crucifixion of Good Friday and resurrection of Easter, we are called to join more fully in the walk of faith. We spend this season centering ourselves on the work of those who followed Jesus, the early disciples/apostles, as we seek out ways to live into the faith that they demonstrated so fully in their own lives. Each Sunday in Eastertide is treated as a 'mini-Easter', and each day treated like the first time the disciples got to see Jesus, a celebration that calls us deeper into the love and new-life that sits at the heart of the season and at the heart of our faith.

#### MONTHLY MEAL MINISTRY UPDATES - CHANGES AFOOT

Kanal Kitchen is considering a refocus in our ministry. This seems to happen about every six to eight years or so – not by design, but because the Spirit seems to nudge us. What began as a youth group activity became an ongoing monthly

mission in which we opened our doors and invited all who were hungry to visit and eat. It became burdensome to drive the guests down in batches from Elkton over time, so when The Paris Foundation began serving from a dining room on Bridge Street, we joined in and offered our hospitality there. Due to repeated flooding incidents and COVID interruptions, Paris Foundation received a grant of land to build their own facility in Hollingsworth Manor. They are serving brown bag meals from a temporary trailer/office as they fundraise in order to build. Their ministry has become more focused on the families in that community, and attempting to break the cycle of poverty there.

While we applaud that effort, and support the work of the Paris Foundation, the Kanal Kitchen core workers have felt we are beginning to be pulled away from our original intent. We continue to want to provide a monthly meal to the neediest, and in doing so have some personal contact with our guests. After careful consideration, we have decided we are being led to reach out to Meeting Ground through the Mary Randall Center. We would offer a monthly meal to the homeless there, and it is shared with the Men's Shelter at Settlement House.

That does not mean we are turning our backs on the Paris Foundation. We will continue to provide our usual meal until we can make a smooth transition so there is no gap in service, or hardship for anyone involved. Once the building is up, we may find ways to help out in keeping with our mission and theirs.

In addition, Kanal Kitchen is hoping to develop a "garden to table" ministry at Clairvaux Farm. The program there assists families transition to self-sufficiency. This further outreach is in the planning stages, and will need some volunteers from our church family who have an interest.

These are exciting opportunities, and there is room for many hands. As our path becomes clearer, I will inform you all, and let you know how you can be a part. There are few things quite as satisfying as "feeding His lambs," and we hope you can join in.
