






The Monday Morning Bible Study taught by Paula Lutz and held at the home of Barbara Dean will begin **Monday**,

Finance Corner

The financial books have been closed for 2022. There is good news to report...but also some notso-good news to report as well. First, the financial support of the congregation has been very strong! We exceeded expectations by several thousand dollars, we have met our obligations to the Conference and paid all our bills. The not-sogood news is that our costs went up more that the increase in stewardship, and we ended the year with a deficit. All of us can appreciate the inflation in utilities, insurance, and other necessary expenses in our lives. CCUMC was not exempt from these economic facts of life. We have made efforts to control costs but we still must provide for the basic needs of the church in terms of comfort, safety, and essential services. We must all have faith that we will address these challenges with continued strong stewardship and continued efforts to manage costs. You may note that the church is a little cooler in the cold weather, and perhaps a little warmer in the warm weather. You may note that fewer lights are on in the building. You may also note that the offering plate is more visible and that the gifts are acknowledged more strongly in services. These are all steps toward balancing our budget. Also, the financial note in the Sunday bulletin now reflects a true picture of progress toward our giving goals, which was not the case in the past.
