Greetings friends!

Pastor Sam here, I pray that the beginning of spring is treating each of you well and you are not too troubled by allergies and pollen to enjoy the blooming of God's creation. I am always amazed at the fresh beauty God unveils during the springtime, and this year is no exception.

We spend the month of April this year basking in the glow of Easter Sunday, which just passed on March 31. Because of how early Easter is this year, we get to spend the entirety of the month in what is called 'Eastertide', or the season after Easter. During these weeks we remember and celebrate not just Easter itself, but Jesus' great works after the resurrection, preparing for the birth of the church. Just as with every year, we are called and blessed to live into this message in a more full way, to embody again the new life that Christ offers to us and the world.

As we pass Easter again this year I have been focusing my devotions on one of the most enduring parts of this story, that of the empty tomb. So as we continue life after Easter, I pray we all consider not just the cross but the empty grave. Let live into the story of Jesus anew this year, his life death and resurrection, made real in the way we live in the world today. Let our lives repeat the angels chorus, for he is risen, he is risen indeed!

In discussions of the budget for our Church, you have no doubt heard the term "Apportionments". But many of us don't really know what that means, why we pay it, how it's calculated, etc. As we have endured challenges in our finances for several years, the issue of apportionments is important as it represents approximately 11% of our operating budget.

Apportionments are the "fees" that we pay to our Conference in support of their operating costs and ministries. The accumulation of these fees allows the Conference to accomplish beneficial ministries that would not be possible or meaningful if undertaken by the individual church congregation. Apportionments are calculated by dividing the budget of the Conference among the churches in the Conference. Each church's portion is calculated by the same formula, taking into account the total income of the church, modified by factors such as capital expenses and the cost of the church's own missions.

In the past few years, CCUMC has requested reductions in our apportionments due to our own financial challenges. Such reductions have been granted, although the amount of the reduction has generally been diminishing in the recent past. For 2024 we did request a reduction, but it was not granted. This is partly due to the financial strains on the church hierarchy due to the significant disaffiliation of churches arising from disputes in the social inclusiveness of the UMC moving forward. There have been over 80 churches leave the denomination just in our Conference. Of course, there must be adjustments in the Conference budget as many disaffiliating churches were indebted to the Conference.

The payment of apportionments to the UMC is part of what makes us United Methodists through giving and caring. For this year, apportionments represent the aforementioned 11% of our operating budget, or approximately \$22,000.
