Lesson #2: Joseph of Bethlehem

Key Story: Joseph's decision (Matthew1:18-24)

READ: (Matthew 1:18-24)

Joseph Accepts Jesus as His Son

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about[□]: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet[□] did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife.

- Bethlehem was a small farming village. The name Bethlehem means "House of Bread".
- Joseph was a righteous man. He was compassionate toward Mary even when he was well within the Law of Moses to treat her with no compassion.
- Joseph is a model here for making decisions and dealing with doubts. Pray about it, carry it as a question, pester God about it. This is the story of Joseph's utterly unique vocation, as fosterfather of the Son of God.

- 2. Why did God choose Joseph to be the earthly father of Jesus?
- 3. Do you believe God speaks to us in day dreams and night dreams? Why or why not?
