Happy New Year!

One of my favorite parts of this time of year is all the retrospectives that are published reminding us of everything that has happened in the last twelve months. I always amazes me to see which events I remember well, and which events have faded to the point that I thought they had happened along time ago. Along with that, I like to take time and consider all that has happened in my life as well. This, then, is what I use to shape my goals and plans for the next year. I treat these as goals and not resolutions. For whatever reason, I find I am much more responsive to the idea of a goal to achieve instead of a resolution to change in the weeks and months ahead.

As with every year, 2022 is filled with all kinds of possibilities of things to accomplish and for which you can strive. What are the things you are setting out to do? More importantly, do you have a plan that will assist you in doing those things? After all, a goal without a plan is not a goal but a dream and becomes much harder to accomplish.

One of the interesting things about 2022 is that it is the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Luther's translation of the New Testament into German. This was a significant event in the life of the church. Given our access to multiple translations of the Bible that are available to us, it can be hard to imagine that there was a time when very few Bibles were available and those that were available were published in a foreign language (Latin). This meant that God's Word was not readily assessable to most people. Luther's translation, along with the technology of the printing press, changed that and people could finally afford a Bible that they could read at home.

Because we now take it for granted that God's Word will always be available to us, many people have fallen out of the habit of reading God's Word on a regular basis. Therefore, in celebration and thanksgiving for the work of Luther in translating the New Testament into German, we invite and challenge you to join us in reading through the New Testament in the next couple of months. In the newsletter and at church, you will find a five-month reading plan that will guide you through the whole text of the New Testament. On average, you will read about two chapters a day, six days a week. There is also a reading plan for families with children that use the Children's Bible given at baptism.

Such a challenge can be daunting, especially if you are not in the habit of regularly reading the Bible. To help with that, we will celebrate progress along the way, provide Bible studies on Wednesday evenings to explain what is being read, and are here to help you in any way we can. If you do not have a Bible, please let Pastor or Alex know and we will provide one to you.

We pray that you are excited about this as we are. It is an opportunity to grow in your faith and understanding of what God has done for his people. If you have any questions or need encouragement, we are happy to guide you along the way.

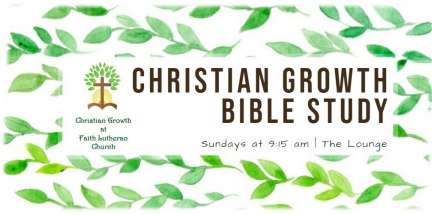

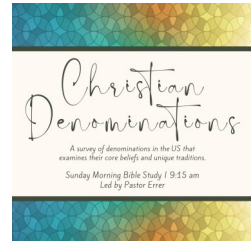
# Bible Study Opportunities at Faith

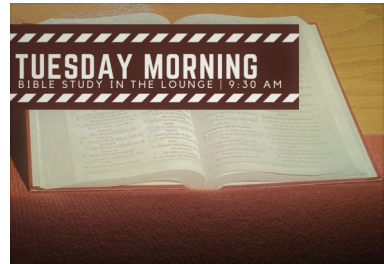

Tuesday mornings at 9:30, join us for a discussion led Bible Study learning more about God's Word and daily life.

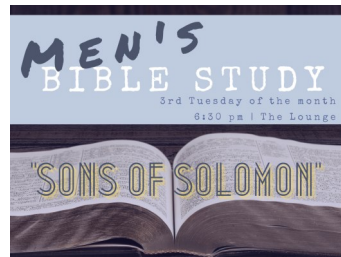


~ 1st Tuesday of the Month ~

## ABOUT

We start with a mat on the floor. It's not fancy but it's warm and it comes with a hearty meal, generously donated by volunteers. It's harm reduction in its simplest form. At a basic level, we want to ensure that no individuals are on the streets of Green Bay in the harsh winter months. But, from the minute a case manager meets with the guest to complete an intake, we are providing wraparound services to ensure that the guest is offered every opportunity to seek out the resources necessary to take steps towards self-sufficiency. This includes drug and alcohol classes, mental health counseling, on-site medical care, services to help those seeking and those who have secured employment, and opportunities to increase one's sense of self-worth through giving back. We offer guests the opportunity to move off the mat on the floor and into their own bed as they take these steps.

## BREAKDOWN

Your contributions help us to sustain our work, which makes a lasting impact on the community:

- \$35 provides one night of shelter for an individual.
- \$2,661 provides a night of shelter for 76 guests.
- \$1,295 transitions a homeless guest back into self-sufficiency.
