How do you celebrate the twelve days of Christmas? Even though the commercial world has moved on, stores have done everything possible to rid themselves of decorations and Christmas specific gifts, and the radio stations have stopped playing Christmas music, Christmas continues until the Feast of Epiphany on January 6. For most of us, the parties have ended (New Year's Eve being the exception), live trees have been taken down and moved outside, and some of the Christmas decorations have been packed away. Yet, for twelve days, within the Christian calendar, we are encouraged to continue to rejoice in the gift of the newborn king. We are encouraged to reflect on the gift of our Savior, given by our heavenly Father, for the sake of our salvation.

Of all the things we do during these twelve days of Christmas, there is one that can serve as a reminder to continually give thanks for the birth of our Lord: reflecting on the gifts we have received and giving thanks for what we have been given. After the wrapping paper has come off the presents and the boxes have all been thrown away, then comes the need to find a place for the new items in your home. Do you have room in your dresser for the new socks and undergarments, or do you have to throw the old ones away? Do your kids have space in their rooms for the new toys that they were given or is it time to purge the toys they no longer use. Being grateful for what we receive means that we not only say thank you to the one who gave it, but that we take care of what we have been given to honor the sacrifice that was made for us to receive it.

Doing this makes us stewards of what we have been given and is a reminder of the way in which we are to care for all that we have because it is all a gift from God. No matter how big or how small, what we have that supports this body and life is given by God for our benefit and our responsibility is to give thanks for his gift and then be a good steward of its use and care.

Part of this responsibility of caring for the gifts we have received is considering how it can be a blessing, not only to ourselves, but others also. Children might not want to share their new presents when they first open the box, but they quickly realize that what allows the new toy to be the most fun is to play with it with someone else. To enjoy it with someone they love. In this way they allow their gift to become an even greater blessing as it blesses others.

As adults, we need to learn the same lesson. The blessings God has given bring the greatest joy when they bless, not only us, but those around us. This year, I am excited to share, that Faith is able to help you with that opportunity. Thanks to a generous gift from the Susan Haber estate, we are able to partner with the LCMS Foundation to offer "Transfer the Blessings," to all members of our congregation. Transfer the Blessings provides estate planning assistance, for free, to any who would like to utilize their service (the final documents will need to be certified by your attorney and that fee is not covered as part of the program). Over the next couple of months, you will learn more about this opportunity and be invited to presentations on estate planning, power of attorney, wills, and the like so that you can be a good steward of what God has given, even after he has called you home. With the guidance of the planning counselor, you will also learn that the blessings you enjoy are magnified when you are able to use them to bless others as well. It is our prayer that you would take the opportunity to participate in this program and extend the celebration of Christmas, the celebration of God's gift, into the year that is to come.



With your help we were able to support 6 families this Christmas.







THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

New year. New me. Out with the old. In with the new. Time to start fresh. The new year can be a wonderful opportunity for many people who like to use the new year as motivation to try something new or start over. This concept should be very familiar to us as Christians. We constantly live in a cycle of being made new or starting fresh – not by our own habits or actions but through God's action in our Baptism. We daily sin and deserve punishment. Our sinful nature will always cause us to fall and fail. But God has drowned our old sinful nature so that we daily emerge new and righteous. This is the constant life we live. A life of sin, repentance, and forgiveness.

What Baptism Indicates

What does such baptizing with water indicate? It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in right-eousness and purity forever.

Where is this written? St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" (Rom 6:4).
