Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church,

As I write this letter, I am sitting in the lower level of the Kroemer Library at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN. The table I have chosen allows me to look out across the pond through a set of corner windows and take in the beautiful, park-like views of the campus. I am here for the Vicarage Supervisor's Conference which is a day and a half conference devoted to helping the vicarage supervisors become better mentors to the men who learn in our congregations. It is also a chance for me to reflect on our program, and the activities of our congregation while attending services, hearing sermons and lectures from other pastors.

One of the things I have been reflecting on is the challenge I have given to the catechism students, elders, and whole congregation regarding sermon reports this year. The challenge is this, each student is to ask three, non-related adults, to sign their sermon reports, each elder is challenged to sign three sermon reports, and everyone else should be watching for students in their vicinity who are filling out a sermon report so you can approach them and ask questions about it.

When you do this, it really involves two things; answering a question regarding what you learned from the sermon or thought was the most important part of the sermon, and then signing that you were the one who answered the question. The goal of this is to create conversations between the students and all of you regarding how to listen to sermons and to see how two people can hear and learn different things from the same message.

It has been interesting to hear the response to this challenge. Some of the students are excited about it (they get a prize for every three adults that they have sign), others are scared to talk to non-related adults, parents are glad that they have three less to read, but from those outside the program, there has been a mix of excitement and anxiety. Excitement to interact with the students and anxiety about writing down the wrong answer on the report.

What I have learned from preaching hundreds of sermons during my ministry is that God uses the words I have prepared to accomplish the goals that he intends. I may have a goal for what I want you to hear and learn during the sermon, but it doesn't always mean that is what you will walk away with, and that is ok. God knows what you need to hear each week and he uses the sermon, the readings, the liturgy, the hymns, and even conversations with other members to give you the conviction of the Law and the comfort of the Gospel every time you attend a service. When you are working with a student on their sermon report, keep that in mind and instead of worrying about the right answer, engage in a conversation about why what you heard mattered and how God is at work, through his Word, in your life right now.

While I do not read the sermon reports (Alex reads them all and I tell him if we believed that good works were the ticket that gets you into heaven, he would have an express ticket for reading them all), Alex does share insights he gleans from the reports he has graded. I am so excited to hear from you as you also hear from the students each week.

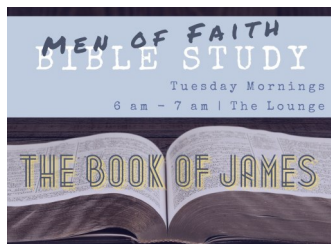

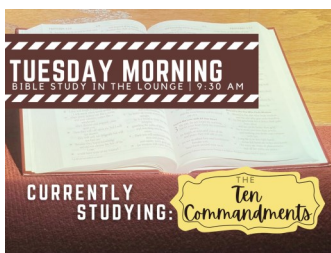
## **Men's Bible Study** **Tuesdays at 6:00 am in the Lounge**

## WHAT BAPTISM INDICATES

Freedom House provides shelter, three meals a day, clothing, classes, basic necessities and case management support to families struggling with homelessness. Freedom House is the only homeless shelter in the Green Bay area that provides services exclusively to homeless families-serving single mothers, single fathers, and couples with children.

The mission of Freedom House is to equip families with the skills and resources needed to become self-sufficient and to maintain self-sufficiency. Freedom House serves a diverse population of homeless families with children through our emergency shelter on the east side of Green Bay and our campus on the west side of Green Bay called The Bridge. Freedom House families are also offered our Aftercare Program for general support and access to the many donations Freedom House receives. This takes some stress off their monthly budget and prevents a second shelter stay.

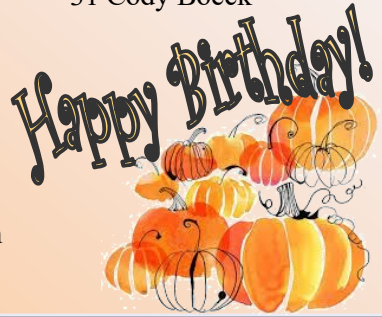
