Read 1 Thessalonians 5:1-3

- 1. Paul's use of "times and seasons" echoes language from Jesus at what dramatic event? (See Acts 1:7)
- 2. Can we know when that day will be?
- 3. Where else does Jesus use this kind of language (including the "thief in the night" imagery") to talk about End Times events?
- 4. Does the "thief in the night" imagery refer to the manner/means or timing of Christ's return?
- 5. How does Paul describe the Day of the Lord, and what will it be like for those who are unbelievers?

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:4-7

- 6. How does Paul use the imagery of "day" and "night" to describe the Christian's life verses the unbeliever's life?
- 7. Does Paul use "sleep" here in the same way that he did in our last passage in 1 Thessalonians 4? How is he using it here?
- 8. Is Paul saying we should abstain from all alcohol? How is he using the ideas of "drunk" verses "sober?"

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:8-11

- 9. How does Paul equip the Thessalonians (and us) for the challenges of our day to day lives?
- 10. What hope do we have when we look to the Day of the Lord?
- 11. How can we use this passage to accomplish Paul's instruction to "encourage and build one another up?"
