I believe in God, the Father Almighty... With just those words, your memory was probably prompted to recall what comes next and you began to think about the rest of the Nicene Creed. For 1,700 years, this creed has been confessed in Christian churches around the world. This summer, we celebrate the anniversary of its creation.

In 325, bishops and theologians representing the Chrisian world gathered in the town of Nicaea (in modern day Turkey) to deal with heresies influencing the Chrisitan church. It was the first time such an event had been held since the Jerusalem Council recorded in Acts when Peter and Paul presented arguments about the incorporation of the Gentiles into the church. Paid for by Emperor Constantine, over 300 people participated in the proceedings. The most significant heresy (false teaching) dealt with by the bishops was Arianism. Arianism taught that Jesus was not co-eternal with the Father but was the Father's creation. Therefore, there would be a time when the Father existed but the Son did not.

While the council dealt with a variety of issues, its most well-known contribution to the Christian church is undoubtably the Nicene Creed. Later amended in 381 to expand the Third Article of the Creed dealing with the Holy Spirit, the creed clarified the identity of Jesus as it is revealed in Scripture. The creed was not a new idea. It expanded on the already confessed Apostles' Creed (not written by the Apostles but called the Apostles' Creed because it confesses the Apostles' faith and teachings) which was based on several passages of Paul's letters.

When we confess the creed, the temptation is to go through the motions and recite it without much thought. However, the creed draws clear lines around what it means to be a Christian and identifies the teaching that cannot be comprised. To be a Christian is to believe what the creed teaches. Rejection of those teachings is a rejection of the faith, and it places you outside of salvation.

To recognize this significant council and the creed that it developed in defense of the Christian faith, the children's lessons this summer will work through the creed and what it means. Over the 15 weeks of summer, we will hear about the teachings of this creed and why they matter. Each week, we will be reminded that every part of the creed reveals God at work for the sake of us, his chosen people.

If you would like to take an even deeper dive into the Nicene Creed, it will also be the topic for the Tuesday morning Bible study after its current study of Judges concludes at the end of July or the beginning of August.

May this confession always be on your lips as you look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.







This first year of Faith Lutheran's college ministry (LCMSU-GB) has been a growing and learning year. I began last summer by contacting pastors of the North Wisconsin District- LCMS to let them know we had begun a college ministry for those attending St. Norbert College, University of Wisconsin – Green Bay, Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, and Bellin College of Nursing. I also contacted Lutheran high schools in Wisconsin to let them know we were here to welcome their students attending these colleges.



I will contact district pastors again this year through an email and in person as I am attending the North Wisconsin District convention in June. There I will have a display table with a map of Wisconsin chapters of LCMSU and giving information about when Faith offers Divine Service as well as other ways students can be involve in our church family.



Through weekly text messages, students were invited to attend Divine Service, our monthly potlucks, and The Feast (the young adult Bible study offered once a month here at Faith). Occasionally I met with students for coffee on or near their campus. While visiting my aunt in Tuscaloosa, AL, I was able to meet with one of Faith's members who was attending the university there!

LCMSU-GB hosted two pizza nights at Rosati's Restaurant where we got to know each other better. Some students attend the same school but had not met. Next year I am planning activities, either on campus or here at Faith, that will give students a chance to form friendships.

Although we never experienced all students attending on the same Sunday, throughout the year we were the church home to several students: a first year student at St Norbert College, a student attending NWTC, and six students attending UW-GB. Of those students, one is transferring to Faith from her Lutheran church in Eau Claire, another is considering taking instruction classes with Pastor to become a member of Faith, another student and his wife became members at our Easter vigil. One student is transferring from UW-GB to attend Concordia – Wisconsin in Mequon. I was able to connect with a student who looks forward to attending Faith next year with his brother.

I will be attending the LCMS Campus Ministry workers conference again this year and look forward to learning more about how to continue to minister to the young adults in our midst. Your support of prayers and friendliness to students over this past school year is greatly appreciated! We look forward to next fall, as we anticipate meeting new friends and revisiting friendships made this year. Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Lord in this way!
