2 Corinthians 8:1-9, 13-15

Read: 2 Corinthians 8:1-9, 13-15

- 1. The question of fairness. What does it mean to be fair? Is it the same as treating everybody equally?
- 2. How does the Bible talk about fairness when it comes to generosity?
- 3. Leviticus 27 ³⁰ "Every tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the trees, is the LORD's; it is holy to the LORD. ³¹ If a man wishes to redeem some of his tithe, he shall add a fifth to it. ³² And every tithe of herds and flocks, every tenth animal of all that pass under the herdsman's staff, shall be holy to the LORD. ³³ One shall not differentiate between good or bad, neither shall he make a substitute for it; and if he does substitute for it, then both it and the substitute shall be holy; it shall not be redeemed." This is the origin of the tithe.
- 4. Why do we bring this up when talking about 2 Corinthians 8? How does Paul broach this topic with the Corinthian church?
- 5. What is the purpose of the offering that Paul is requesting? How is it different than the tithe and why is generosity the key to understanding Paul's request?
- 6. How does Paul understand his request? If it is not a command, what is the nature of his request? How does giving a tithe and then continuing to give out of generosity proof of God's love?
- 7. What is so moving about the Macedonians "begging" to be able to participate in the collection?
- 8. How much, then, is one expected to give in order to be generous?
- 9. How does this relate to our understanding of stewardship? Is tithing or generosity optional for the Christian?
- 10. We end with a quotation of Exodus 16:18 and a reference back to the Israelites receiving manna.
