Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are in the season of love. Since December 26, the stores you love have changed their colors and décor from Christmas red and green to Valentine pink and red. Hearts are available in all kinds of colors and flavors and wherever you look, you are reminded to love. If it were not for the commercialization of the whole holiday, you would think that this was Christian holiday to its core. After all, it lines up with the command we hear over and over again in Scripture- love one another. Love because God has loved you. Love your neighbor as yourself. You don't have to look too long or too hard to find a time when God commands, encourages, and exhorts you to love.

One of the great aspects of Valentine's Day is that even the commercialized love of Valentine's Day teaches us about the love spoken in God's Word for all true love involves sacrifice. Valentine's Day might involve the sacrifice of time and money in order to buy flowers or candy, or go out to dinner, but it is a sacrifice. Those resources can no longer be used in any other way they were given to show someone else how much you care and love. This, in return, teaches us about the love that God has for his people, that he would sacrifice to show his love for us and to protect and preserve the relationship he has given to us in baptism.

The sacrifice he makes is far greater than we would ever consider for most of our neighbors. The idea of giving up your only child so that others might live is unimaginable for us, yet this is what God has done for you. John tells us "God so loved the world that he gave his only son so that whoever believes in him would not perish but have eternal life." Because God has first loved us in this way, we are now able to love one another.

This pay it forward kind of love is at the heart of Valentine's Day. When St. Valentine was arrested because of his Christian faith, fellow Christians would pass him notes of encouragement while he was in prison. They sacrificed their safety in order to love the one who taught them the love of God.

So as you live in this season of love, enjoy the sugared candy hearts, the pink frosting, and the cute little cards. Let them be a reminder to you that we know what love is, that we can understand the messages they send because we know the purest example of love that was ever given. We know that love and sacrifice are always bound together and our acts of love to each other are because HE has first loved us.



We are collecting NEW hygiene and cleaning items for local crisis agencies through The Family Radio's annual "Help for the Homeless" hygiene drive, Feb.13-March 6. Please place your donations in the Help for the Homeless collection box by March 6. Supplying these items to local shelters will help them direct their limited funds to providing qualified staff, counseling, food, and shelter to those they serve. Most urgently needed items are laundry soap, kitchen size trash bags (shelters go thru LOTS of these), shampoo, cleaning supplies, diapers, toilet tissue, and feminine care. Your donations will remain in this community. Note: Food Share (formerly Food Stamps) does not cover the cost of non-food items such as soap and diapers. Thank you!

Items most needed are:

- Soaps: laundry, dish, soft, shower gel, 2-in -1 shampoo
- Trash bags (shelters especially need these for bedrooms!)
- Diapers (sizes 3-6 and Pull-Ups)
- Deodorant (unscented)

- Wet Wipes for babies
- Toilet paper
- Paper towels
- Disposable razors
- Tampons and pads (pads for young teens)

ABOUT

We start with a mat on the floor. It's not fancy but it's warm and it comes with a hearty meal, generously donated by volunteers. It's harm reduction in its simplest form. At a basic level, we want to ensure that no individuals are on the streets of Green Bay in the harsh winter months. But, from the minute a case manager meets with the guest to complete an intake, we are providing wraparound services to ensure that the guest is offered every opportunity to seek out the resources necessary to take steps towards self-sufficiency. This includes drug and alcohol classes, mental health counseling, on-site medical care, services to help those seeking and those who have secured employment, and opportunities to increase one's sense of self-worth through giving back. We offer guests the opportunity to move off the mat on the floor and into their own bed as they take these steps.

Your contributions help us to sustain our work, which makes a lasting impact on the community:

- \$35 provides one night of shelter for an individual.
- \$2,661 provides a night of shelter for 76 guests.
- \$1,295 transitions a homeless guest back into self-sufficiency.


