We welcome Adelaney Julianna Perez who has joined God's family through Holy Baptism at the 9:30 am service. She is the daughter of Vanessa Perez.

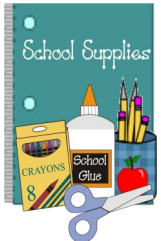


ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN SCHOOL KITS

Food Drive

Vicar Nathaniel Hall and family will be arriving the last full week in July. We will be collecting items for a food pantry. If you would like to contribute, please place your donations in the box located by the Church Office. ***The family has no food allergies, however, no food dyes, no high fructose corn syrup, and please avoid unnecessary additives.***

Here is a list of items they would appreciate:



Food

Seasoning/Spices - Iodized salt, pepper, garlic powder, ginger, cinnamon, Italian seasoning

Canned goods - Black beans, corn (no sugar added), peas, tomato sauce, tomato paste, Pineapple tidbits (in juice, not syrup)

Baking: King Arthur All Purpose flour, vanilla, cocoa powder (prefer dark but regular OK), chocolate chips (semi sweet or dark), honey, wheat berries (hard white or soft white)

Snacks: Olives, Snyder's pretzel snaps, Dill pickle spears (no dyes), Cerebelly Smart Bars for kids

Cooking: Avocado oil, chicken, beef, or vegetable stock (minimal additives), Worcestershire sauce

Other: Dry Pasta (any kind really), brown or white rice, Santa Cruz lemon juice or lime juice, red or green lentils, Nature Made Prenatal Vitamins with DHA + Folic Acid

Cleaning & Paper Products: Seventh Generation Free and Clear dish soap, Tissues, Cottonelle Ultra Clean Toilet Paper

Hospitality: A Christian Virtue ***Evangelism through Hospitality***

"The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man." (Matthew 13:37) God works all things according to his will. As Christ proclaimed from the cross; "It is finished." Our salvation is accomplished and given freely by grace through faith. As we daily praise God, we may ask this question; "What is there for us to do then?" We know He has prepared good works for us to walk in for the sake of our neighbor, and commanded "Love thy neighbor as thyself." (Mark 12:31). How do we do this? By exercising the uniquely Christian virtue: Hospitality.

We are called to be hospitable: cordial, generous, receiving others with gladness and kindness. Many examples of hospitality can be found all throughout scripture. When God visits Abraham by the oaks of Mamre in Genesis 18, Abraham is quick to show hospitality. "O Lord, if I have found favor in your sight, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." Hospitality reflects God's love for us and shows forth divine love to others. Those whom we show this love to may not be who we expect. "Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." (Hebrews 12:1-2) Be considerate of the stranger.

The Apostles encourage us often. "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Romans 12:12-13) "Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1 Peter 4:9-10.)

What does hospitality look like? It can take many forms. Ultimately, it is being genuinely interested in another's well-being for their own sake. Ask someone, "How can I serve you? What do you need?" Evangelism is bringing the Gospel, the greatest news, to another, something people desperately need. "If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled,' without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that?" (James 2:15-16) We are called not just to evangelize, but to care for the bodily needs of others with the gifts we have been given. "We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

This is how we can show forth Christ's love by our actions, which makes a tremendous impact, and demonstrates how the love of Christ transforms lives. Engage in hospitality, and you will be doing evangelism.
