Dear Saints in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church,

What is the holiest season of the Church Year? Perhaps that seems an inappropriate question. After all, each season in the annual cycle we observe has its distinct spiritual character. There is the anticipation of Advent, the glorious rejoicing of Christmas, the exuberant triumph of Easter, and the resounding power of Pentecost. But, what season invites us more than any other to a repentant reflection, to a changing of the patterns of our lives, to a new dimension of devotion? That season is Lent (my favorite time of the Church Year), the 40-day penitential period of preparation for the celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Day. Each year, on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, the liturgy of the Church calls us to begin "a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection," when "our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of Our Lord Jesus Christ."

It is on Ash Wednesday that we observe the ancient tradition of receiving the Sign of the Cross in ashes upon the forehead, reminding us of our human frailty and serving as a sign of our repentance, sorrow, sin, and need for God's grace, as we hear the words from Genesis 3:19, when God spoke to Adam after the Fall into sin, now spoken to us: Remember that "you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Just as the people of Israel marked their doors at the first Passover with the blood of the lamb, shielding them from the Angel of Death, the ash on our foreheads is marked in the shape of a cross, reminding us of the Lamb of God (Agnus Dei), "that takest away the sin of the world" (LSB DSIII, p. 198). Jesus, the Lamb of God, has saved us by His Blood and marked us in Holy Baptism as His own, that we might not taste eternal death but live with Him forever. We repent in view of the Lamb that was slain, trusting that in His Blood we have the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

Often, we hear people talk about Lent as a season for 'giving up' things - pop, sweets, etc. - for a time. Growing up, my family participated in this custom. My go-to was coffee. This is the more modern take on the historical practice of fasting during the Lenten season. While it is certainly fine to do something like this, it is important to remember, that Lent is not only a time to 'give up' something that we enjoy, a small sacrifice in remembrance of Christ, but Lent is a time for 'putting on' practices we normally might not observe all year long. In other words, Lent is not a time to DECREASE something, but to INCREASE in almsgiving, true fasting and prayer, in order to aid us in repentance, sharpen our focus on Christ and His Passion (suffering), and deepen our attention to His Word.

Ultimately, Lent is a season of penitential preparation. We are preparing to celebrate Easter. Whenever the Church is preparing, she does so in repentance. That is not to say our preparations save us. We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone! But, Lenten preparations allow us to get out of the way, yes, even die to self, crucify the Old Adam, that we might fix our eyes upon Jesus and hold fast to Him. He went to the cross. He kept the Lenten fast. He won the victory over death and the grave through the shedding of His most holy and precious Blood. It's Jesus' Lenten observance, not our Lenten observance, that saves us!

It is my joy and fervent desire to enter this solemn and holy season with you, as we prepare ourselves - better yet, as we are prepared by the Lord - to celebrate the Paschal mystery, Our Lord's Passover from death to life!







FOLLOWING CHRIST TO THE CROSS: PEOPLE IN JOHN'S GOSPEL

John tells us why he wrote his gospel. "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:30–31) Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life and eternal life. That's God's gift to you!







Lent: Entering a Time of Lament in Worship

None of us probably wants to be reminded of the things we have lost during the pandemic. The list is so long, from smaller things like the loss of familiar routines all the way up to life-changing events like the loss of employment or the death of family members or friends. Indeed the past two years make us feel like we have much in common with the trials of Job from the Old Testament. As we approach the season of Lent this year, we are once again reminded of our greatest loss, that is, of our perfect relationship with our Creator. Ever since the fall into sin in the garden we have been in a constant struggle against the devil and our sinful natures. We want to follow faithfully, but we are weak and fall far short of the glory of God. But thanks be to God that he has taken mercy on us and graciously forgives those with contrite and repentant hearts.

How does this season play itself out in our worship? The hymn texts and psalms sung during Lent help us to enumerate and express the ways that we suffer under our sins and all the other personal losses in our lives. Our suffering is very real and we have an innate need to cry out and be heard. It is a forthright acknowledgment that we are not perfect and that we have indeed walked through very deep valleys or low moments in our lives. Those times are a necessary contrast to the mountain-top experiences that we so wish we could live every day. Just like the disciples on the mount of Transfiguration, we want to stay within the peace and comfort that Jesus offers.

Every year as we move through the Lenten season there are people who remark that the music of this time is some of their favorite of the whole church year. That observation used to surprise me as I assumed that most people preferred the happier music of the festive seasons. What it reveals instead is that we all recognize the need for this time of introspection in which we look more deeply into our relationship with God and one another. What are those things that keep us from following Jesus more closely and truly trusting in His saving grace?

May you blessed to search out your heart in this Lententide and arrive restored and rejoicing at Easter. It is not by coincidence that one of our most well-known Easter hymns (LSB #461) is rooted in a passage from Job -- the book of suffering: For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. Job 19:25.
