Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we near the end of Lent and begin to see the glimmer of Easter in the near future, it is worth considering why the date of Easter changes from year to year. Unlike Christmas, which has the fixed date of December 25 (which is determined by the date of the first Good Friday), Easter's date is bound to the lunar calendar and the cycles of the moon. Therefore, "Easter is always the Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox on March 21. This full moon may happen on any date between March 21 and April 18 inclusive. If the full moon falls on Sunday, Easter Day is the following Sunday. Easter Day cannot be earlier than March 22 or later than April 25 (LSB, xxiii)."

Of all the Christian holidays, Easter is the one that has been celebrated the longest. From the very beginning of the Christian church, Easter was celebrated to rejoice in the resurrection of Christ. Given the name Easter, because the sun rises in the East, this has been the great feast of the Church as God's people rejoice in what he has done to forgive their sins and grant them eternal life.

The customs of the celebration all join together to proclaim the promise of new life, new birth, and the signs of hope. Nature gives us the awakening of spring, the promise of a future. Chicks come from an egg, "breaking free from the bonds of what has held them captive" and taking the breath of life. Easter breakfast, chocolate, and rich breads and pastries are all part of the way the Christian community breaks the community fast that began on Ash Wednesday. The services of Holy Week join together to take the Christian through the stories of Jesus' passion to the joy of his resurrection. Beginning with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, followed by the celebration of the institution of the Lord's Supper, then the betrayal at Gethsemane, the horrifying crucifixion, his rest in the tomb, and finally the joy of the resurrection, we gather to consider each of the moments and give thanks for what God is doing in them and through them for our sake.

This is why Easter is the "Queen of the Feasts" for the Christian church. It is the reason for Christ's coming, it is the culmination of his work, and it is the pattern for all the Divine Services that follow. Each Sunday is its own little Easter, rejoicing in the triumph of what God has done. It is the holiday celebrated year around. It is the day that the Lord has made, and we are privileged to rejoice and be glad in it.

What is the Seder Meal?

The word "seder" is a Hebrew word for "set order" or "service." The festival of Passover is celebrated according to this set order. God commanded that the first Passover be commemorated in a solemn yearly feast: the people were to sacrifice a lamb and partake of it with unleavened bread (a reminder of the hasty flight from Egypt when there was no time to bake leavened bread) in thanksgiving for the freedom which was God's gift. While we no longer celebrate the Passover every year, this can be a reminder of God's Gospel message seen through the Exodus story.

FOLLOWING CHRIST TO THE CROSS: PEOPLE IN JOHN'S GOSPEL

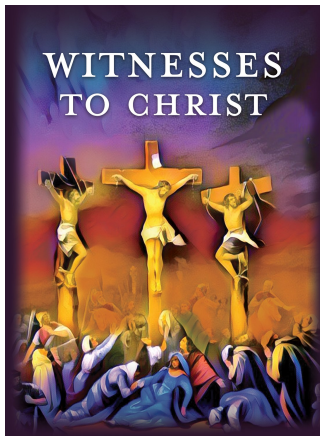
John tells us why he wrote his gospel. "Jesus did many other signs in the
