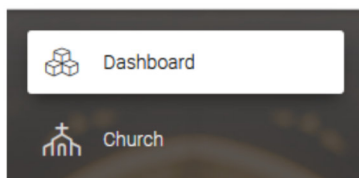

FCP committee needs YOU!

At the May Voters Meeting, there was significant information shared and lengthy discussion concerning the attendance and financial trends of the preschool over the last five years and the outlook going forward. We also discussed the current financial status of the church.

Before making a decision, those attending requested a committee be formed to study potential scenarios for ongoing preschool operations or any alternatives, and supply an analysis by November for a congregational vote. Ideally that analysis would be complete and presented before the November Voters meeting since our 2027 budget proposal is shared in that meeting and could be impacted by the preschool question.

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church,

This month, our church body, the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, will be meeting in convention in Arizona. The convention is held every three years to deal with issues facing our church, set the goals and priorities for the next three years, elect officers, and provide updates on the work of what our church and its affiliates in the United States and around the world. This year, two of our members will be attending the convention. Bruce Zittlow is serving as the lay voting delegate for our circuit and Deaconess is serving as an advisory delegate for our district.

Both of those designations are important in understanding how our church body is organized and why we are called a synod. Synod is a Greek word that means assembly or meeting and is often reserved for use within church organizations. So, when we say we are part of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, what we are saying is that our congregation is part of the assembly of Lutheran Churches headquartered in Missouri (fun fact: the original name, until 1947, was "The German Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio, and Other States). There are almost 6,000 congregations that join together to form our synod.

For the sake of oversight and relationships, congregations are grouped into circuits. Circuits pull together congregations in a geographic area to support one another and provide accountability and encouragement for the pastors. Our circuit includes the congregations in Green Bay, Pulaski, Wayside, Luxemburg, Algoma, Forestville, and Sturgeon Bay. Each circuit elects one pastor to serve as our Circuit Visitor who serves as the pastor to the pastors. He also helps congregations during vacancy and conflict, and supports the work of the congregation. Many of our met our Circuit Visitor, Pastor Larry Yaw from Pulaski, when I was unable to lead services during Holy Week this year.

Those circuits are then joined into districts. The LCMS is divided into 35 districts with all but two based on geography. Each of those districts has a president, a board of directors, and other staff that oversee the work of the congregations and pastors in their area. They provide resources for various ministry activities, assist congregations in calling a pastor during a vacancy, and try to facilitate joint congregational efforts in ministry and mission.

Finally, the presidents of the districts for the Council of Presidents which is one of the governing boards of our Synod. They, along with the Synod President and the various boards headquartered in St. Louis, MO, execute our national and international agenda, send out missionaries, oversee the schools and universities, and the countless other activities of our church, such as leading the convention this summer.

At the convention this summer, voting representatives are chosen at the circuit level. Each circuit designates one lay person and one pastor, who must be from different congregations, to attend and vote. The only voting that happens in advance of the convention is for Synod President, which began in early June and is held online. One pastor and one lay person from each congregation is able to vote in that election.

If you would like to learn more about what is happening at the convention, or watch it online July 18-23, you can do so through the LCMS website, lcms.org. The services and essays that are presented are often quite moving and the debates can be interesting. It is worth checking in just to see how it looks.
