Food Drive

Vicar Nathaniel Hall and family will be arriving the last full week in July (Vicar Installation will be August 2). We will be collecting items for a food pantry. If you would like to contribute, please place your donations in the box located by the Church Office.

The family has no food allergies, however, no food dyes, no high fructose corn syrup, and please avoid unnecessary additives.

Here is a list of items they would appreciate:



Food

Seasoning/Spices - Iodized salt, pepper, garlic powder, ginger, cinnamon, Italian seasoning

Canned goods - Black beans, corn (no sugar added), peas, tomato sauce, tomato paste, Pineapple tidbits (in juice, not syrup)

Baking: King Arthur All Purpose flour, vanilla, cocoa powder (prefer dark but regular OK), chocolate chips (semi sweet or dark), honey, wheat berries (hard white or soft white)

Snacks: Olives, Snyder's pretzel snaps, Dill pickle spears (no dyes), Cerebelly Smart Bars for kids

Cooking: Avocado oil, chicken, beef, or vegetable stock (minimal additives), Worcestershire sauce

Other: Dry Pasta (any kind really), brown or white rice, Santa Cruz lemon juice or lime juice, red or green lentils, Nature Made Prenatal Vitamins with DHA + Folic Acid

Cleaning & Paper Products: Seventh Generation Free and Clear dish soap, Tissues, Cottonelle Ultra Clean Toilet Paper

Evangelism: First Things

To do evangelism is to share the best news; the Gospel of what Christ Jesus has accomplished for us and freely given to us. We must comprehend the Gospel by faith before we can go forth and share this proclamation of God's abundant mercy and love with others. Thus, as we begin learning about evangelism, we start with Holy Scripture, which shows us our foundation.

The scriptures do not just contain the Gospel. Recall Pastor Errers' sermon on Romans 7 last Sunday. The Law is given so that we recognize our sin, and ultimately recognize our need for a savior. The Law can be uncomfortable to talk about and hard to hear, as it awakens us to our sinful nature and daily shortcomings. But the Law is good and shows God's intention for our lives. We will never fulfill the Law, but we still strive to follow God's will for our lives, upheld by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit grants us repentance by contrition (remorse over sin) and faith. As Christ our Lord says; "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15). We cannot make ourselves righteous. We are, by nature, sinful and unclean, utterly unable to save ourselves by our own works. We look at our sin and can feel hopeless. In despair we cry out with Saint Paul "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?" (Romans 7:24)

Oh, but then, light breaks forth and shines upon us mightily. Not just any light, but the true light, the eternal Word, God from whom we receive grace upon grace (John 1). Jesus, the Christ, the Son of the Living God, incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and made man. He was crucified and died for our sins (past, present, and future) and was raised from the dead. Whoever believes in him shall have eternal life! On his ascension into heaven, he said "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew, 28:19) You are baptized in the name of God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, adopted and united with Christ. "By grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8) Again we cry out with Saint Paul "Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" (Romans 7:25)

This is fundamental for evangelism: take heart and be comforted by our Savior. Take time to learn about what God has done for you. Engage in prayerful meditation on Holy Scripture. You can recite the Creed and Lord's Prayer on your commute, remember your baptism daily, and receive Christ's body and blood regularly. Do not be frustrated if you forget to pray before bed or only have five minutes to read a quick Bible passage on your lunch break. It takes time to establish a rhythm in our busy world. These things are not to be a burden, but a benefit to you. Engaging in these daily rhythms will greatly aid you in sharing the Gospel with those in need; those you love. Evangelism begins with these first things, and they remain important as we learn how to speak to others about Jesus.
