- While corporate confession and absolution is present at most services, if you would like to meet with Pastor privately, please speak with him to schedule a time for confession.
- Children are welcomed into our service and encouraged to participate with the rest of the congregation. If they do need some "wiggle room," you may move to the Wiggle Room (located in the narthex area), until they are ready to return to the service.

Visitors and Guests: Welcome to Faith Lutheran Church. We are blessed to have you with us.

- While most of what you will need for service is found in this service folder, if the indication LSB appears, it refers to the Lutheran Service Book, which is found in the hymnal rack on the back of the pew in front of you.
- Please speak with Pastor before receiving the Lord's Supper. If you do not have the opportunity before service begins, you are welcome to receive a blessing during communion. Please indicate this desire by crossing your arms during the distribution of the sacrament.

College Students: Please let us know how we can assist you during your time away from home. Be sure to introduce yourself to Pastor or Deaconess before leaving and indicate your university and contact information in the red record of fellowship book.

Our bulletin cover features Rachel, the newest addition to our nativity. Given in memory of Marylin Ebert, Rachel reminds us that the birth of Jesus is for all people. Luke records that when the shepherds saw the baby lying in a manger, "they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them." While Rachel does not appear by name in the story of the nativity of our Lord, she stands in wonder, representing all who have heard the Good News of Jesus' birth and now glorify and praise God for what he has done. Her basket of fruit is particularly fitting because it reminds us that Christ's birth is Good News for all of creation. She reminds us that all good things come from God and this Thanksgiving we thank him for providing all we need to support our body and soul.
