In the Book of Proverbs, King Solomon begins his instruction with this first lesson, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction (Proverbs 1:7)." It is from this premise that God-given wisdom is obtained in a three-step process that guides the Christian as they live the life of faith.

He begins with the concept of knowledge. This is the essential foundation of wisdom and it begins with knowing the Lord himself. As those who live on this side of the resurrection, for us it means that we know God and the one he sent, Jesus Christ (John 17:3). Just as the Commandments are anchored in the understanding that we should, "fear, love, and trust, in God above all things," so too our knowledge should be anchored in the fear of God. Not what we are terrified of him as you might be terrified of nightmares that frighten you, but that we fear him in the same way a child would fear their parents, or we might fear legal authorities. We understand that because they have authority over us, they are something other than we are and therefore have the right to discipline us and hold us accountable for our actions. Fearing the Lord, understanding that he has authority over us, is the beginning of knowledge because it recognizes his ability to discipline us and hold us accountable for what we have done.

After gaining knowledge, the Christian is to practice discipline. Discipline allows the believer to act wisely. Throughout the Proverbs, Solomon reveals that discipline, expressed as righteousness, justice, and equity, may not be the way that the world would act but they are the actions that characterize God himself. The Christian life is restrained by discipline and the understanding that just because you can do something doesn't mean you should do something. Disciplining yourself to act in accordance with God's actions begins with the knowledge of who he is and the leads to the third part of the process- growth in wisdom.

Growth in wisdom is the fruit of a disciplined life. Those who know God and place their faith in him still face the risk of being led away from wisdom and into a life of foolishness and death. No matter how much one may know, the wisest recognize there is still more to learn, so they return to the Word of God to gain greater insight to who God is and then discipline themselves to reflect that new understanding.

As we look to the return of the education schedule on September 8, when Sunday morning Bible study, Christian growth, catechism class, women's Bible study, and other classes resume, this should be present in our mind. Christian education is anchored in the Divine Service and these classes are an outgrowth of God serving his people. Each of these opportunities is offered to help you grow according to Solomon's way; obtain knowledge of who God is, discipline your life according to his ways, and then grow in wisdom by repeating the process all over again. We are never done until Christ calls us to our eternal rest. This fall do not be the fool who despises wisdom and instruction (Solomon's words, not mine) and join in the Christian growth of our congregation.

Tuesday Morning Bible Study Tuesdays at 9:30 am in the Lounge



We also have a link on the Faith Lutheran website for people looking for a church home-away-from-home while they attend college. Plans include going to each local campus weekly to meet with students as well as periodic gatherings at Faith so even more friendships can be made!

I was able to talk to the new campus pastor at CUW, Pastor Bakker, who was once the campus pastor for our own Pr. and Mrs. Errer while they were students in Michigan!


LET'S MAKE SOME HATS!


