Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Faith Lutheran Church,

One of my favorite memories as a child, is when riding in the pickup with either my Dad or Grandpa and hearing Paul Harvey come on the radio. Each episode, lasting 3-4 minutes, would tell the story of a famous person or event but he would withhold a key piece of information until the very end. It was only after he shared that final piece of information that the story would make sense and he would close with his famous line, “and now you know, the rest of the story.”

The stories of the Old Testament are much like these legendary recordings from Paul Harvey. Many of them are well known or have made their way into the fabric of our culture. On their own, they are interesting stories and records of human history. However, when they stand alone, they are incomplete. It is only after you hear what God has done and promises to do for the redemption of creation that the Old Testament story can be resolved and can make sense. Keeping this in mind, our Lenten series for this year will pick up this idea and present, “The Rest of the Story.”

The Lenten season begins on February 18, with Ash Wednesday. It concludes with the Easter Vigil on April 4. During the Easter Vigil, the church reads from a traditional set of 12 readings that record the highlights of God’s work of salvation for his people. Each of those readings show God’s power over sin, death, and the devil. Yet, on their own, you never know how the story of salvation comes to an end. That is why we need the rest of the story. We need to hear the story of the resurrection to have the fulfillment of God’s work for his people. We need Easter to understand how and why God has saved his people. Each of the mid-week services, after Ash Wednesday, will take look at one or two of those Easter Vigil readings. We will hear of God’s work in the Old Testament and learn how it points us ahead to his greatest work on Easter. This way, when Easter comes, we will know the rest of the story. We will know what has lead up to Christ’s work on the cross and how the cross lets us make sense of the world and how God has interacted with his creation. (*Lenten image on cover*)


As we look ahead to Lent, don’t forget that we have two midweek services with a meal in between. Mid-week service times will be 4:00 and 6:30, with the meal being served from 5:00-6:00. If you have not attended a service or meal before, I would encourage you to add it to your Lenten discipline this year. It is a wonderful way to prepare for Easter while also spending unhurried time with your church family. The Wednesday nights of Lent are a great blessing to all who participate.

Greetings from the Evangelism Committee at Faith Lutheran Church

Witnessing, also called evangelism, is the work of individual Christians to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with people in their everyday lives.

We often think of evangelism with some anxiety. What is it? How do we do it? How do I know if I'll be good at it? However, there is no need to fear.

It can be helpful to consider evangelism within the context of two words: witness and outreach. This is a perspective on evangelism offered by the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

Witness is the work we have been given to do as the church scattered. We have opportunities to speak of Jesus with the people in our everyday lives who are our friends, co-workers, neighbors, family members, etc.

Outreach is the work we do as the church gathered. It is our collective effort through ministries, services, events and other activities as the church through which we invite and include others into Word and Sacrament ministry.

Witness & Outreach are distinct, but they work together so people will know of Jesus and be gathered into His Church through us.

This is work that every Christian can do, and it can start with those you know and love. Going out of your way to love your neighbor, to help someone in need, or to listen to a friend when they need you can all be amazing ways of witnessing to others.

Being involved in the activities and mission of the church is a terrific thing. At Faith Lutheran Church, the Evangelism Committee is here to aid the church in Witnessing and Outreach, and we are open to new members to help us with Evangelism-related events and planning. 




