Cynthia grew up on the family farm in Theresa and loved the scenic, rolling countryside. After graduating Mayville High School as the salutatorian of her class, Cynthia furthered her education at the University of Wisconsin – Oshkosh, and Education

earning degrees in English and Education.

Cindy was united in marriage to Larry Volz, on May 18, 1980, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Brown Deer, marking the beginning of a shared life filled with love and devotion.
