Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

New faces. That could be our theme for this month. May also brings the opportunity to welcome two new students into our midst. Over the next couple of years, Faith will serve as a field work congregation for deaconess student Deirdre Batiansila. After returning to WI from serving in the mission field helping Syrian refugees in Germany, Deirdre has enrolled at Concordia Theological Seminary as a distance deaconess student. This means she will study here in Green Bay and we have the privilege and opportunity to give her a place to learn and put into practice what she is learning in the classroom. What is a deaconess? She is someone who serves the church in acts of mercy according to her gifts and passions. Be sure to introduce yourself and ask more about this incredible field of service in our church.

At the time of the writing of this article, we do not yet know who our new vicar will be. But we look forward to seeing his new face as well. Remember, we say farewell to the Souers in July and welcome the new vicar in August.

Faith Christian Preschool is also developing a new face. A merger between the preschool and Trinity is underway and it is offering incredible opportunities to both schools. The goal is to have the merger in place by July 1.

Our congregation also gets to put on a new face soon. We are very near/have already paid off our mortgage and for the first time in almost fifteen years, we are debt free. What an incredible blessing this is and thank you to all of the different faces and people who have made this possible. I look forward to the opportunities and challenges we take on together in the future.

NEW COVID PROTOCOL PLAN

At the regularly scheduled council meeting on April 13, a new COVID protocol plan was adopted. This plan is designed to take into consideration the availability of vaccinations, the CDCs recent announcement regarding the safety of touching common surfaces, and the lifting of the state's mask mandate. The new plan is as follows:

Faith Lutheran Church will continue to observe its current COVID 19 protocols until the end of day on May 24 with two exceptions: hymnals are to be returned to the pews immediately and when our current supply of aerosol disinfectant runs out, we will cease to aerosol the sanctuary between services. Beginning May 25, all COVID protocols will be lifted.

Questions regarding this policy:

1. Why was that date chosen? This date was chosen to allow ample time for those who desire to be vaccinated to receive the full vaccination with the waiting periods. Wisconsin has had open vaccination since the beginning of April and spots are available for people to sign up to receive the vaccine.
2. What if I want to continue to wear my mask? You are welcome to continue to wear your mask after May 25 while you at Faith. This is not a prohibition against masks, it is simply the lifting of the protocols and their enforcement.
3. What if a new mandate is put in place? The council, elders, and Pastor have maintained from the beginning of the pandemic that we will not ignore a mandate that governs our community. Faith is located in the Village of Allouez. If the village, state, or federal government were to introduce a new mandate, we would follow their requirements.
4. What if there is a surge in numbers? The council will continue to monitor the hospitalization and fatality rates due to COVID 19. They will adjust the protocols in the event it is deemed necessary.

5. Who do I talk to if I am unhappy with these changes? Please feel free to contact Pastor, a council member, or your elder to discuss your concerns. We always welcome the ability to explain decisions and hear your concerns regarding life within the congregation.
6. What about other churches in the area? At this time, all LCMS congregations are in the process of updating their COVID protocols. Many of the area LCMS congregations have already lifted those protocols, others are still determining next steps. Each congregation is making the decisions they feel are best for their people and community.
7. Will live streaming continue for those who are not yet comfortable returning service? Yes. Faith is committed to offering a live stream of weekly services for shut ins and those who are unable to attend in person. In fact, we are in the process of updating the system and adding cameras to improve and enhance the stream.

As we prepare for these changes, please keep in mind that it is good practice, at all times, to wash your hands regularly and if you are ill, please join us from home. Please also be sensitive to the anxiety and concerns of those around you. As you return, do not read comfortability as carelessness and if you are comfortable please respect the desires of those who are being cautious.

Faith Christian Preschool Merger

Faith Christian Preschool is excited to announce that it will be merging with Trinity Lutheran School and will be brought into the North East Wisconsin Lutheran School Association! This is an exciting opportunity for Faith Christian Preschool as it prepares to continue to offer exceptional Christian education to children aged 3-5. Over the next several months, representatives and teachers from both schools will work together to finalize the merger by July 1, 2021 in order to have the preschool incorporated into the school by the first day of school this fall. With this change, questions are sure to arise, below are some frequently asked questions and their answers.

1. How does this impact the preschool? Faith Christian Preschool is currently licensed by the State of Wisconsin as a day care facility. By becoming a part of Trinity and the school association, it will be relicensed as a school which will open up new opportunities for growth within the program. It will receive accreditation through the schools and in future years be able to participate in the state voucher program. This will also open the possibility for expanded offerings such as wrap around care that are not currently possible through our current license. In the past, the preschool has had to hire for three positions (director, lead teacher, and assistant teacher). Trinity's principal will take over the director responsibilities thereby reducing the necessary staff needed to run the program.
2. What does this mean for Trinity? Trinity has been blessed with incredible growth over the last couple of years and has expanded in amazing ways. This merger allows them to continue to grow by offering Christian education at the 3K and 4K ages (which they currently do not offer). It may also offer future opportunities for expanded bussing options, recruitment, and staffing through this expanded grade and facility footprint.

3. What does this mean for Faith Lutheran Church? Faith is a proud and longtime member of the Lutheran School Association and is a founding member of Trinity. In the same way we supported the merger of NEW Lutheran High School and Trinity a couple years ago, this is part of our vision of offering high quality Lutheran education to our families. The preschool will continue to be held at Faith Lutheran Church and we will continue to support preschool education through our staff (leading chapels, assisting with programing, etc.), facility, and fundraising as we have in the past. We believe that this merger will offer greater opportunities for our families going forward.
4. What does this mean for the students and families currently enrolled in the preschool? The quality of education will only be enhanced through this merger. In the short term, not much will change for the students. Long term they will have access to greater resources and options as the program avails itself to the opportunities Trinity will provide.
5. What about the current teaching staff? Our current teachers (one of whom also serves as the director) will be able to stay as teachers. They will be hired/called to serve on the Trinity staff and Trinity will begin to move them to the pay scale offered to their teachers. Trinity recognizes the exceptional quality of teachers serving our preschool and looks forward to having them as part of their education team.

As this merger is in the works, please pray that God would continue to bless Christian education in Green Bay. It is a tremendous blessing to be able to partner with our schools as they help share the Gospel with the students entrusted to their care.

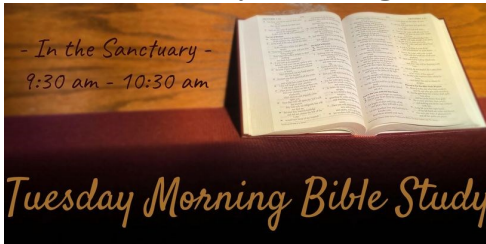

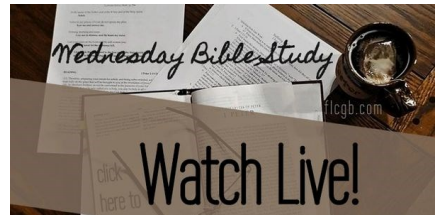

WELCOME VICAR-ELECT ANTHONY KEILANI BEGINNING AUGUST 1, 2021



Greetings, members of Faith Lutheran Church!

My name is Anthony Keilani, and I will be your new vicar. I grew up in southeast Michigan, a suburb of Detroit. A product of the Lutheran School educational system, I matriculated at the University of Michigan and majored in Neuroscience. After being graduated in 2016, I worked as an assistant instructor for Neuroanatomy at Oakland University in Rochester, Mich. My wife Irene is a pastor's daughter from Boyne City, a town in northern Michigan. We met in late 2017 at the St. Michael's Liturgical Conference in Detroit and were married in June 2018 at her father's congregation, Hope Lutheran Church, in Bellaire, Mich. While living in northern Michigan after our wedding, I was a substitute teacher in the school district where Irene attended high school. I enjoyed that year very much. My brothers- and sister-in-law were students there, and they were in some of the classes I taught.

Sadly, Irene miscarried early in her first pregnancy. Very quickly, however, Irene conceived again, and Sylvia Ann was born in May 2019. Our youngest, Esther Louise, was born in November 2020. Irene has been chipping away at her bachelor's degree at Purdue University's Fort Wayne campus. She is due to be graduated during our fourth year of seminary. When she gets a quiet moment, Irene enjoys pilates, crocheting and cooking.

Sylvia Ann is our curly-haired dancing queen. She enjoys music with a strong rhythm and can find the beat very quickly to perform her twirling moves. You may find her clutching a silicone smoothie straw in her hand and kissing her bunny blanket tenderly. Her best friend is her sister Esther. They can make each other laugh just by making eye contact.

Esther was born with a condition called Phenylketonuria (fen-ul-key-toe-NU-ree-uh), also known as PKU. It is a rare inherited disorder that causes an amino acid called phenylalanine (Phe) to build up in the body. PKU is caused by a defect in the gene that helps create the enzyme needed to break down phenylalanine. Without the enzyme necessary to process phenylalanine, a dangerous buildup can develop when a person with PKU eats foods that contains protein or eats aspartame, an artificial sweetener. This can eventually lead to serious health problems. For the rest of their lives, people with PKU — babies, children, and adults — need to follow a diet that limits phenylalanine, which is found mostly in foods that contain protein. Esther has been visiting a genetics lab located an hour northwest of Fort Wayne in Topeka, Ind. She has a team of medical professionals to take care of her, including: a genetic counselor, a geneticist, a dietician, and many nurses that think she is the happiest baby girl they have ever seen. We are thankful to write, that so far she has not required

any special medical formula that is “Phe-Free”. She is growing quickly and strong by drinking breastmilk. Please keep us in your prayers. Monitoring Esther’s blood levels will forever be a part of her life, and we await the results monthly to evaluate her needs. When she is older and eating solid foods, we anticipate her needing a low protein diet most similar to that of a vegan diet, which avoids all animal products: eggs, meat, cheese, milk, fish. While diet is the main focus, there are a few medications that she could take to help her body break down the amino acid. We will cross that bridge when we get there, and we trust that we are in good hands with the team of doctors she has now.



FAITH’S NEW DEACONESS STUDENT

Deirdre Batiansila Christiansen has been attending Faith Lutheran Church since her return from Leipzig, Germany in 2019. She worked with LCMS partner church, SELK, helping their mission to inner-city Germans and Middle Eastern refugees. Before her 16 months in Germany, she lived in Grafton, WI. She was active at her congregation, Luther Memorial

Chapel in Shorewood in different capacities including International Outreach, Board of Education activities, and coffee hour lady. She is happy to be able to help here at Faith.

Deirdre's deaconess studies are primarily online with on-campus intensive learning sessions two times a year at Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft Wayne, IN. These classes, as well as work with the congregation, will help in forming her service to the Lord.

Deirdre is the oldest daughter of Rev A.E. Batiansila (deceased) and Christa Batiansila who is a member of Faith. You might have heard the ten Batiansila family sing during a Sunday morning service.

Music and Worship



“Is This the Feast???”

Yes, yes it is! Some members of the congregation have correctly noticed that during this Easter season we have been singing the second version of the liturgical text “This is the Feast” typically referred to as the Hymn of Praise. The question more often asked is, why are we singing this every week?

In the pattern of worship that has been handed down to us from centuries of Christian worship we prepare ourselves for worship through contrition (confession and absolution, and the kyrie - “Lord, have mercy”) followed by a joyful hymn of praise recounting God’s gracious work of salvation for us. The hymn of praise which has been in longest use is the Gloria in excelsis, or “Glory to God in the highest,” and begins with the song of angels from Luke 2 (see Lutheran Service Book p. 187 or p. 204). During the development of new liturgical materials in the 1960s and 70s another hymn of praise “This is the Feast” was developed for inclusion in the new settings of the Divine Service included in the new Lutheran hymnals from this period.

“This is the Feast” draws upon a whole different portion of scripture – the metaphoric and ecstatic language of the book of Revelation. This different liturgical text and musical settings of it are more appropriate to the season of Easter and the Sundays near the end of the church which emphasize the end times, the kingship of Jesus, and the second coming of Christ. This is why we sing it during the entirety of the Easter season and on All Saints’ Day.

Ideally we would include all parts of the liturgy at every divine service. But because of our schedule of a “normal” Sunday morning which includes an education hour, and now, even more so because of the limitations of the pandemic, we emphasize those parts of the liturgy that most strongly reinforce the time in the church we are currently celebrating. We sing the kyrie (“Lord, have mercy”) and offertory “Create in Me” during the penitential season of Lent, and put those aside to sing “This is the Feast” and alleluias during the Easter season.

This brings us back to the question of the why sing the alternate setting of “This is the Feast.” Our hymnal offers five different settings of the liturgy – the parts of the service that change very little from week to week. Just as emphasizing different parts of the liturgy adds variety to worship within the church year, using the different settings also adds a welcome variety to the services. The setting of “This is the Feast” we are currently using matches the musical setting of the communion liturgy from Divine Service - 2, and more importantly, during this time when we still trying to keep the services shorter in length, it is half as long.

I know that many people are very attached to the other setting of “This is the Feast.” That setting is not going away – we will sing it again many times in the future. We should look at it as an additive process, rather as a replacement. If we learn a second setting, we then have a choice between two, and at this particular time the shorter setting has much to commend it. I also hope that you find that the more you sing it, the more you will come to appreciate it for its own musical style. As the expression goes, we like what we know. And, in this case we perhaps just need to get to know it a little better.
