Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Generosity and thankfulness. If you had to choose a theme for this time of year, I think that those two words would define it. In many ways, they are the two side of the same coin; generosity springs from the gratitude and thankfulness you feel toward the life you have and the blessings that it contains. Thankfulness then flows from the lessons you learn when you respond to the needs of your neighbors and are reminded of the many ways you have been blessed. One leads to the other and each one compliments the other.

When we practice stewardship, generosity and thankfulness are the outcomes of the skills and attitudes stewardship helps to develop. In the Bible, Jesus praises the widow who gives all she has to the temple and the Bible instructs that those who believe should give a tithe, or ten percent, of all that they have. Have you ever wondered why these models are held up to us as examples for the Christian life? It is because they give us a right understanding of the blessings God bestows on us every day. The way that we respond to the needs of others and to the needs of the church is an outgrowth of the ways that God has already blessed us. This is one of the reasons why Jesus praises the widow's offering; it might not have been much when compared to the other gifts that were given that day, but it was a generous portion of what she had received and she responded accordingly. When she gave, she did so in thankfulness and faithfulness with what God had provided to her.

This year has been a challenging one in countless ways. It has tested the faith and the wellbeing of almost everyone in one way or another. One of those ways will be reflected in our All Saints Day commemoration. This year we will be adding eleven names to the vine and branches memorial. These names will tell the story of a people ranging in age from a pre-teen to their late 90s. Those names tell the story of families grieving for mothers and fathers, children and grandchildren, and spouses and lifelong friends. Part of what has made grief so difficult this year is the inability to gather with those who shared in your grief and experience the generosity of their love and grief and their thankfulness in being a part of the life of the one you also loved. For those who grieve, the experience of loneliness and isolation in grief was all the more magnified because of the pandemic that rages around us.

And yet, even in the face of these kinds of challenges, there is still much for which to be thankful this year because the faithful Christian knows that our life is not measured in the things of this world, but in the grace that God shows his people. So in the face of the challenges given to us this past year, we must also take on this challenge: looking to see how God is still present in our lives and how we are blessed by that presence. What you see at first might seem small, like a widow's mite, but when you see it through the eyes of thanksgiving, you will be able to see your God at work as He remains present in your life, even during the most difficult of times.



IMPORTANT INFO FOR CATECHISM:



IT'S ALL ABOUT COMMUNITY

For the observances of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation launched by Martin Luther our church body, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod adopted the theme "It's All About Jesus." Indeed, it was then, and still is. Our following in His way is what allows us to wear the name Christian. In all circumstances it's good to be reminded that Jesus is central to all we are and do. And, in particularly difficult times such as this pandemic, Christ gives us a guide for navigating the difficulties of this life.

In the pages of the professional and theological publications that I read there is one central theme that keeps appearing — we are all mourning the loss of community resulting from shutting down of our normal activities. Especially among church workers, we have been denied many of the tools that we typically use to build up the body of Christ in very direct and personal ways.

For that reason, I am so thankful that even in its modified form we are still able to worship in person. We are called to be together to support and serve one another. Consider that even in the Ten Commandments there are more that speak to our relationship with others than with our relationship to God. And, throughout his all his letters to various congregations, the apostle Paul reminds us that we are called by Christ to serve and encourage one another in the faith. We are communal creatures.

This is likely the reason that we as Lutherans tend to favor the term "communion" over the other names for the sacrament such as the Eucharist or the Lord's Supper. It is something that we do together because Christ has commanded it. It is also the reason that the novel concept of virtual communion (blessing the elements through a computer connection) does not work. While we can't join together in full tables at the communion rail with our brothers and sisters at this time, at least we are indeed in the presence of one another, a "real presence" if you allow that play on the term that is used to describe our Lutheran sacramental theology.

I understand that there is still fear among members of our flock which prevents them from joining us in worship and/or communion at this time. Please know that you are still very much numbered among us and we'll continue to pray for you and with you until that time when we can worship together in all the fullness that the church has known for centuries. We look forward to that day with great anticipation.

Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith.


