3. How is that fading glory a “type” or “shadow” of the glory to come in the New Covenant?
4. How does Paul use the veil as a metaphor relating to faith?
5. How does one “turn to the Lord” to have the veil removed from their hearts?
6. How do we behold the glory of the Lord?
7. How are we transformed into the same image?

Read 2 Corinthians 4:1-6

8. The Corinthians had gone through their share of drama, both from internal and external sources. How does Paul comfort and encourage them here?
9. How might the Gospel be veiled from sight? Who works to keep the unbelievers “veiled?”
10. How does the light of Christ shine even in the midst of darkness, despair, and “veiled eyes?”
11. How does this passage connect to the Transfiguration of our Lord?
